1. The UN/CEFACT Programme of Work 2012-2013 (ECE/TRADE/C/CEFACT/2012/11) was approved under agenda item 9 during the eighteenth Plenary Session of the Centre for Trade Facilitation and Electronic Business (UN/CEFACT), which was held from 15-17 February 2012 in Geneva.

2. Comments and suggested additions were made by delegations<sup>1</sup> during the discussion concerning the UN/CEFACT Programme of Work 2012-2013.

3. As noted in the report of the session (ECE/TRADE/C/CEFACT/2012/12, paragraph 44, decision 12-15), the Plenary requested the Bureau to compile these suggestions into an addendum to the Programme of Work, which is presented here.
