Project title: Enhancing strategic environmental assessment and transboundary environmental impact assessment in Eastern Europe and the Caucasus

Expected timing/ duration: September 2018 – September 2022

#### Objective and brief summary of the project:

The main objective of the project is to enhance strategic environmental assessment (SEA) and transboundary environmental impact assessment (EIA) in six beneficiary countries with a view to preventing and mitigating damage to the environment and health from the economic growth. The project aims to reinforce and sustain the results achieved in the countries so far by ensuring that their newly established legislation on SEA and EIA is complemented with secondary regulations, fully aligned with the UNECE Convention on Environmental Impact Assessment in a Transboundary Context (Espoo Convention), its Protocol on Strategic Environmental Assessment (Protocol on SEA), and systematically applied for greening national economies and for sustainable development. The project will improve environmental governance by enhancing transparency of decision-making, cross-sectoral cooperation, public participation and stakeholder consultation. The project will promote transboundary and regional cooperation in assessing environmental impacts. The objective of the project will be achieved by implementing the following activities:

- A1.1. Providing substantive legal support to amend the primary legislation or to develop/finalize secondary legislation to fully align it with UNECE treaties and EU directives in four selected beneficiary countries;
- A1.2. Organizing 4 capacity-building events (one in each of the four selected countries) to support the adoption of the legislation;
- A2.1. Conducting 5 pilots on SEA (or transboundary EIA) to provide hands-on learning for implementing the SEA procedure, involving analytical and consultative tasks, in accordance with the Protocol on SEA (or the Espoo Convention);
- A2.2. Organizing 12 training events (two in each of the six beneficiary countries) on the application of SEA and transboundary EIA;
- A2.3. Organizing 6 awareness raising events (one in each of the six beneficiary countries) to promote the application the national SEA (or the transboundary EIA) legislation:
- A2.4. Producing a video on transboundary EIA and the Espoo Convention (in English and the national languages of the five beneficiary countries) to promote the application of transboundary EIA and its benefits;
- A2.5. Preparing awareness raising materials (a leaflet on good practice in SEA/transboundary EIA, a brochure on the role of public participation in SEA/EIA) on SEA and/or transboundary EIA (one per country in each of the six countries);
- A2.6. Preparing up to 6 sector or issue-specific guidelines on SEA to complement existing general guidelines on SEA;
- A2.7. Organizing two sub-regional events (i.e. training workshops and/or study tours) to facilitate information exchange and experience sharing among the beneficiary countries;
- A2.8. Developing a model for a SEA database to support application of SEA procedures.

#### **Expected results of the project:**

EA1. Enhanced national legislative framework for SEA and transboundary EIA fully aligned with the UNECE Espoo Convention and its Protocol on SEA:

EA2. Improved national capacities to apply SEA and transboundary EIA procedures in accordance with the UNECE Espoo Convention and its Protocol on SEA.

#### Target group and beneficiaries of the project:

Target groups: (i) National and local authorities from the environment, health and economic sectors and land-use planning authorities, (ii) SEA and EIA practitioners, (iii) NGOs, academia, and private sector (e.g. project developers). Beneficiary countries: Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Republic of Moldova, Ukraine.

#### Justification of project and its relationship to the programme of work:

The proposed project is linked to the Expected accomplishment (b) "Strengthened implementation of ECE multilateral environmental commitments and increased geographical coverage" of the Subprogramme 1 "Environment" of the UNECE Strategic framework for 2018–2019. Beneficiary countries have expressed their need for receiving further support from UNECE on SEA and EIA. The project contributes to the implementation of the Programme of Work of the Espoo Convention and its Protocol for 2017–2020 (ECE/MP.EIA/23/Add.1–ECE/MP.EIA/SEA/7/Add.1, decision VII/3–III/3, annexes I and II).
