All the CES work supports the achievement and measurement of SDGs

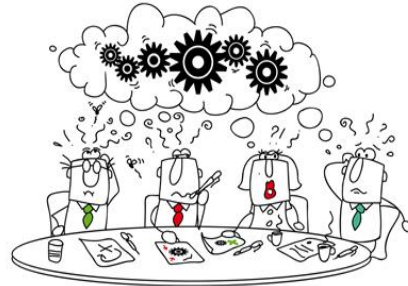


# Key achievements in 2018 and 2019



## 73 events

- 33 Expert meetings
- 8 Task force meetings (back-to-back with expert meetings)
- 22 Training workshops for EECCA
- **Close collaboration with Eurostat, EFTA, OECD, UNSD, regional commissions**

- **Coordination of data flows**
- **Ensuring countries' influence on the global data collection**

# Modernization of statistical production

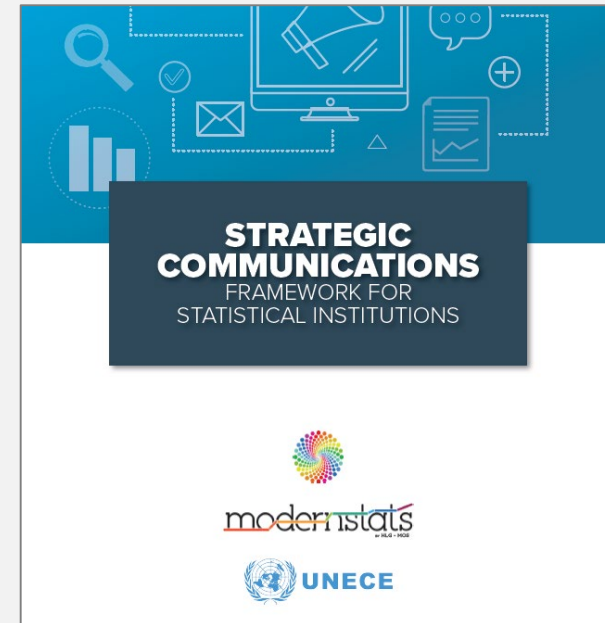


## Priorities

- New data sources including big data
- Strategic communication

## Main challenges

- Access to data
- Need for new skills and evolution of organization culture
- Competing data providers



- New versions of 3 models: GSBPM, GSIM and GAMS0.

GSBPM is used by more than **45** countries and several international organizations.

- Capturing activities of large multinationals
- Digital and platform economy

## Population, gender and society



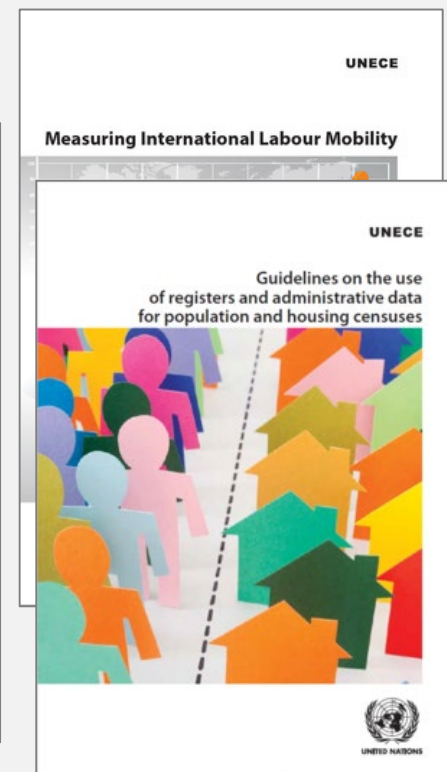
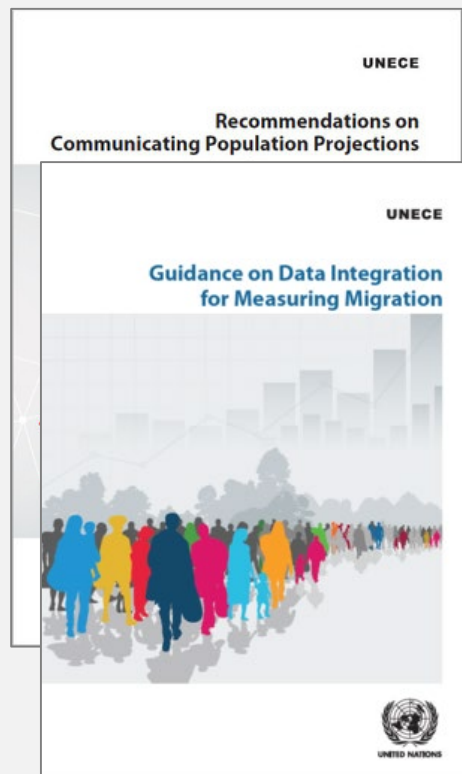

- Poverty and social exclusion
- Population censuses
- Gender statistics
- Migration statistics and labour mobility

### Main challenges

- Use of new data sources and administrative records
- Capturing hard-to-reach populations
- New residence and travel patterns challenging current concepts



In the 2020 round, all **56** UNECE member States will conduct a population and housing census.

# Environment, climate change and hazardous events

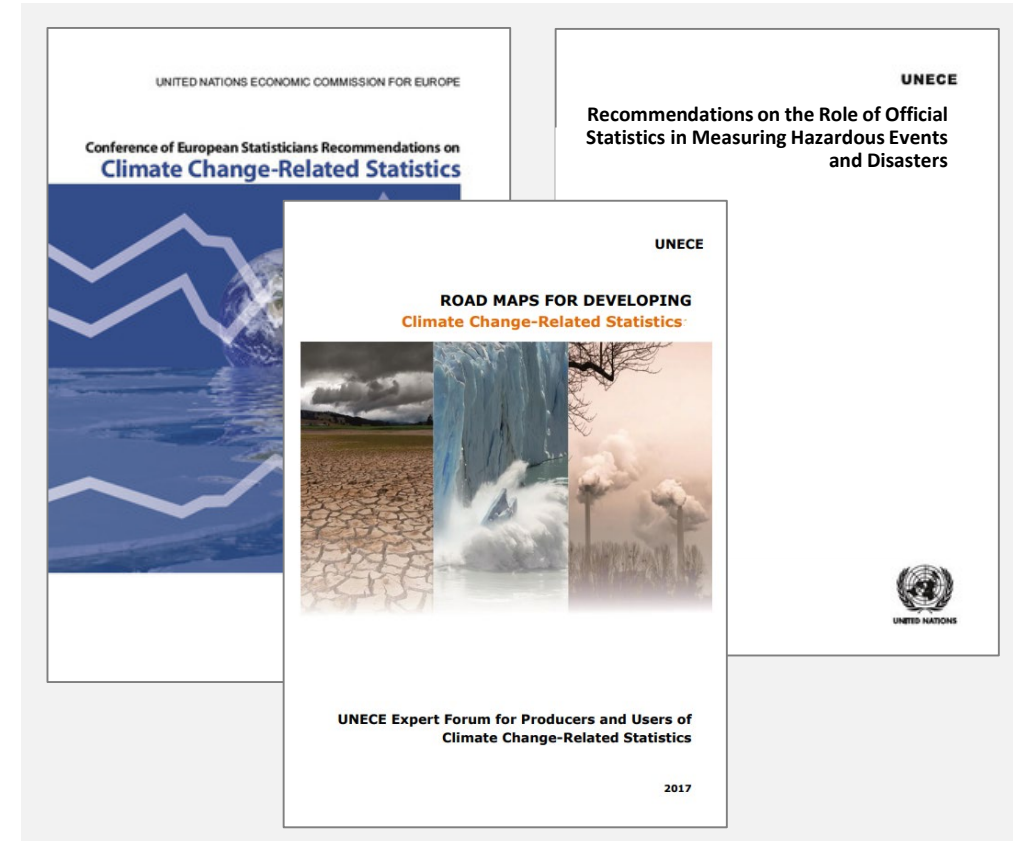


## Priorities

- Climate change-related indicators
- Hazardous events and disasters
- Waste statistics

## Main challenges

- Lowest data availability among the pillars of sustainable development
- New roles for statistical offices
- Scarce resources

## Strategic and managerial issues

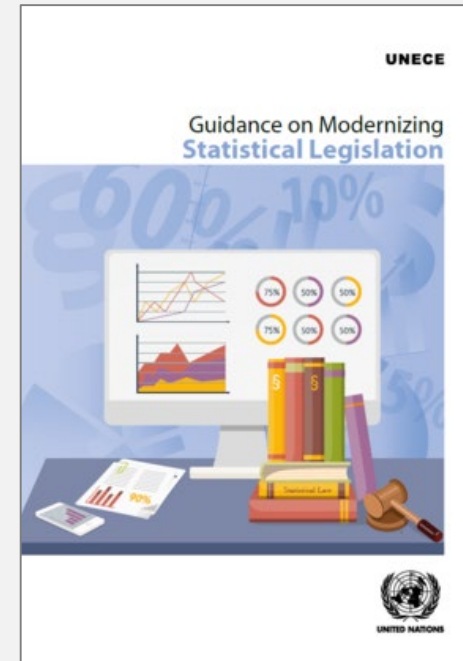


### Priorities

- **Measuring and communicating the value of official statistics**

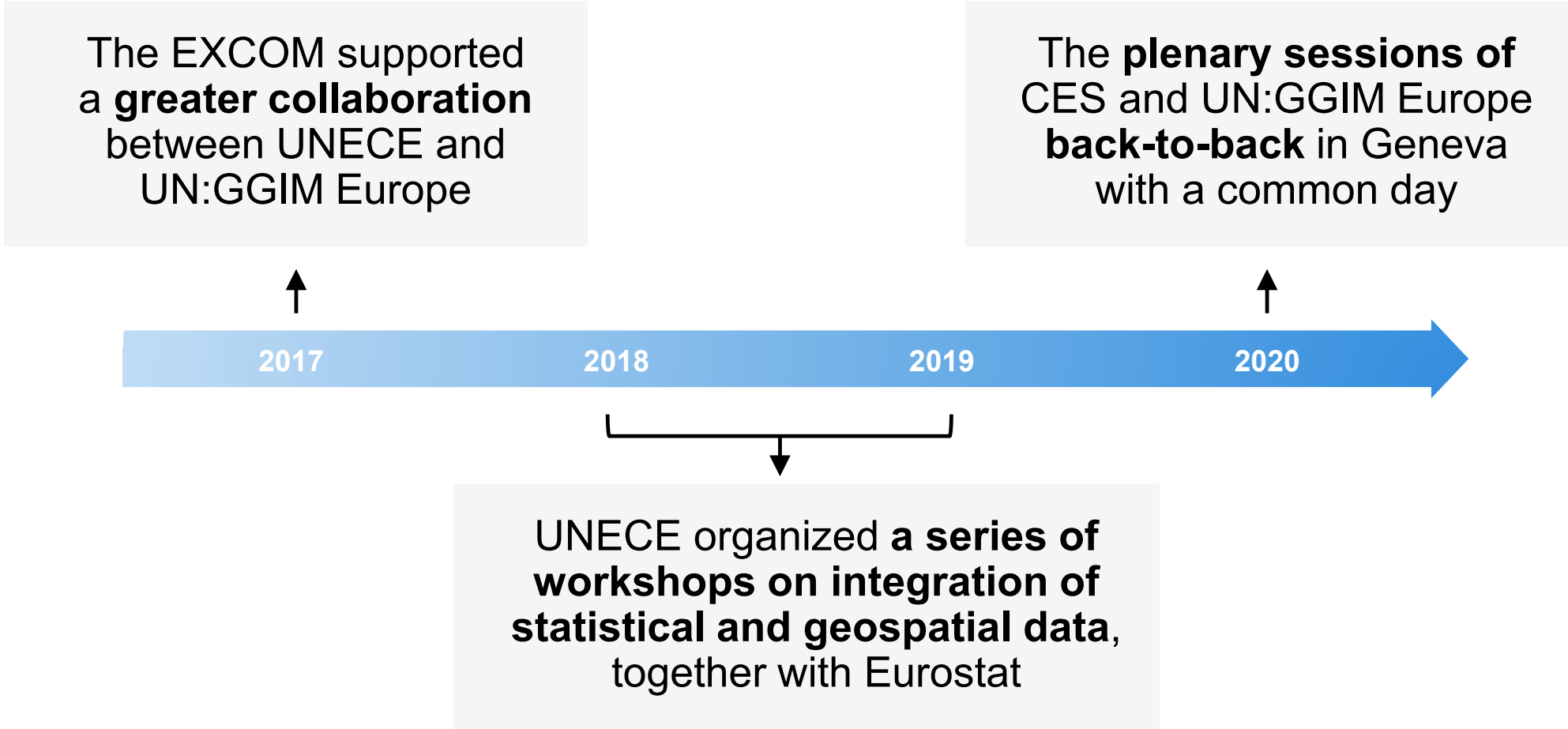
### Main challenges
