## 4<sup>th</sup> Biannual Financial Report: period to 30 June 2010 (between 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> sessions of the Meeting of the Parties)

# Introduction

The Meeting of the Parties to the Espoo Convention (the Convention on Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) in a Transboundary Context, adopted in Espoo, Finland) requested, at its fourth session, "the secretariat to continue to prepare and submit to the Bureau biannual reports with the view to assisting in the preparation of the report to the fifth meeting of the Parties" (decision IV/8, para. 9). The Meeting further requested "the secretariat, in accordance with the financial rules of the United Nations, to monitor the expenditure of the funds and to prepare a report for the next meeting of the Parties, based on the information contained in the biannual reports" (decision IV/8, para. 13)

This document is the **fourth** report in the period between the fourth and fifth sessions of the Meetings of the Parties; it covers the period to 30 June 2010. The first part of the report sets out (cash) income, in-kind contributions and (cash) expenditure in the reporting period, as well as the balance in the Espoo Convention's Trust Fund at the end of the period. The second part of the report sets the above in the context of the budget, indicating expected cash and in-kind contributions and expected expenditure. The report addresses work under the Convention, including its Protocol on Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA).

As described later, the pledges made at the fourth session of the Meeting of the Parties appear at present to be insufficient to cover the budget. The Parties are invited to come forward with further contributions, noting that the Meeting of the Parties (decision IV/8, paras. 7-8) encouraged:

(a) Parties that have so far not pledged anything to make contributions during the current and future budget cycles; and

(b) Parties that have so far only committed limited funds or in-kind contributions to raise their contributions during the current and future budget cycles.

The Chair of the Bureau wrote to a number of Parties early in 2009 for this purpose, as requested by the Meeting of the Parties. Parties contacted have made since unpledged contributions, though these contributions were not necessarily in response to the letter by the Chair.

# 1. Income and expenditure to date

Table 1 presents the income and expenditure, from the fourth session of the Meeting of the Parties to 30 June 2010.

Parties have made 'cash' contributions to the Espoo Convention's Trust Fund (Tables A.1 and A.2), either fulfilling pledges made at the fourth meeting of the Parties, or in response to later

appeals by the secretariat and the Chair of the Bureau. There are two **outstanding (i.e. yet to be fulfilled) pledges** for 2009 (Portugal—EUR 5,000; Romania—US\$ 6,000).

The activities under the workplan were assigned priorities 1, 2 or 3 in the budget (decision IV/8). The Czech Republic and Slovenia have imposed conditions on their contributions, with US\$ 9,000, less programme support costs, earmarked for priority 2 activities. Germany, Norway and Switzerland have provided additional unpledged contributions, earmarked primarily to support participation by countries with economies in transition.

Two priority 2 activities were not completed within the previous intersessional period and were therefore carried forward, together with their budget: a capacity-building workshop for Eastern Europe (US\$ 30,000) and a subregional cooperation workshop for the Mediterranean Sea (US\$ 23,869) (decision IV/8, annex, para. 12). Both of these activities have now been completed.

The cash income together with the funds for the carried-over activities totalled US\$ 585,108.

The secretariat has spent from the Trust Fund in accordance with the budget (Table A.3, with further details in Table A.4). The funds have been spent on nine priority 1 activities (two meetings of the Working Group on EIA, four sessions of the Implementation Committee, the independent review of Ukraine, the technical assistance to Armenia, and the external expert to provide secretariat support), and on five priority 2 activities (the postponed capacity-building workshop for Eastern Europe, two free-standing meetings of the Bureau, a seminar on legislation and procedures for the implementation of the Convention, and secretariat travel in relation to the workplan).

There has not been any overspend on workplan activities beyond the budgeted amount for a budget line. The 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> sessions of the Implementation Committee cost more than budgeted, but costs are expected to decline because one less country (Azerbaijan) is to receive financial support, in accordance with the criteria adopted by the Committee on Environmental

Policy (ECE/CEP/155, annex I). Though the total costs of financial support for the 12<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Working Group on EIA were below budget, the costs of participation by representatives of non-governmental organizations were slightly over budget; similarly for the 13<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Working Group, the costs of participation of non-ECE States was over budget but the overall meeting costs were below budget .

The expenditure totalled US\$ 496,169, leaving a balance in the Trust Fund of US\$ 88,938.

Parties, other States and organizations have also undertaken nine priority-2 workplan activities by providing in-kind contributions (Table A.5): a subregional SEA training workshop for countries of South-Eastern Europe; a subregional cooperation meeting in Bulgaria for the countries of South-Eastern Europe; a subregional training workshop on strategic environmental assessment (SEA) for the countries of South-Eastern Europe; a subregional workshop on the outcome of a pilot project in Central Asia; a seminar on largescale projects; a subregional cooperation meeting in Lithuania for the countries of the Baltic Sea area; a seminar on legislation and procedures; a national SEA awareness-raising workshop held in Slovenia; and a subregional cooperation meeting in Tunis for the countries of the Mediterranean Sea area. These activities have been valued at US\$ 125,452 in total, according to the budget indicated by the Meeting of the Parties. An additional subregional cooperation meeting for the countries of South-Eastern Europe was held in Montenegro in December 2009, following that country's ratification of both the Convention and its Protocol; the only expenditure from the Trust Fund for this workshop was to cover attendance by the secretariat.

Funds through the Environment and Security Initiative have been disbursed to support a pilot project in Belarus, which received Government approval in June 2010. Funds from the same source were available to support the planned subregional workshop for the Caucasus, which has not been held.

In addition, a separate operating reserve of US\$ 262,862 has been created by carrying forward unspent funds from the period between the third and fourth sessions of the Meeting of the Parties, as decided by the Meeting of the Parties (decision IV/8, annex, para. 14). The operating reserve provides contingency funding to ensure continued operations under the Convention in the event of unanticipated problems, for example delayed receipt of contributions.

# 2. The budgetary setting

Table 2 presents the budgetary requirements for the period between the fourth and fifth sessions of the Meeting of the Parties, identifying how much of the budget has already been covered by expenditure and in-kind contributions. The calculation of the outstanding budgetary requirements also takes into account savings that have been made. The savings to date are from the organization of the postponed capacity-building workshop for Eastern Europe at US\$ 7,169 below budget, and from the organization of an independent review in Ukraine and technical assistance in Armenia, with total savings of US\$ 24,552. A saving of US\$ 3,869 has been identified for the Tunis workshop, as the budget available (US\$ 23,869) was larger than the US\$ 20,000 assigned by default to such workshops. In addition, the secretariat arranged informal translations of necessary documents for the seminar on legislation and procedures without use of the Trust Fund, saving US\$ 20,000.

Further savings of US\$ 70,000 have been foreseen as the Working Group on SEA will not be established before the fifth session of the Meeting of the Parties to the Convention, because of the delayed entry into force of the Protocol. In addition, given the outstanding budgetary requirements, it is clear that priority-3 activities will not be funded and must therefore be cancelled with savings of US\$ 150,000: further secretariat support for the implementation of the Convention and the Protocol (consultants; promotional materials; secretariat travel in relation to the workplan).

Table 3 presents the resources already available, or expected to be available, in the remainder of the intersessional period, taking into account remaining pledged contributions, in cash or in-kind.

There is a substantial difference between the outstanding budgetary requirements of US\$ 881,695 (Table 2) and the expected resources available of US\$ 529,000 (Table 3), representing a potential shortfall for the budget. This shortfall needs to be addressed through savings and additional contributions if the workplan is to be completed. The secretariat has drawn the attention of the Bureau to this shortfall, to seek guidance on how it might be reduced. Savings may be achieved, for example, through the holding back-to-back of the fifth session of the Meeting of the Parties to the Convention with the Meeting of the Parties to the Convention serving as the first meeting of the Parties to the Protocol on SEA. The final meeting of the Working Group on EIA planned in this intersessional period might also be held back-to-back with the fifth session of the Meeting of the Parties to the Convention. Further savings may be required on translations, consultants, promotional materials and secretariat travel.
