CONSIDERATION OF PROPOSALS FOR REVISION OF STANDARDS
CULTIVATED MUSHROOMS

Note by the Secretariat

The following proposals for additions to the Standard for Cultivated Mushrooms have been submitted by the delegation of the United Kingdom.

PROPOSALS FOR ADDITIONS TO THE STANDARD FOR CULTIVATED MUSHROOMS (FFV-24)

The UK would like to make the following proposals for additions to the Standard for Cultivated Mushrooms.

- a) Under Section I. Definition of Produce following "In both groups a distinction is made between : " a third group of mushrooms to be added as follows:

3. Flat Mushrooms, i.e. mushrooms that are fully open but neither too cupped nor inverted.

Flat mushrooms are very important to the UK market and are sold as a distinct type. If it is agreed to add this extra group reference to "open cap or flat" as given in the brackets in 2. Open Mushrooms, can be removed.

- b) Section II. Provisions concerning Quality: under B. Classification (i) Extra Class first paragraph to add after well formed **and mushrooms in the closed category must have a dense texture.**

- c) Section III. Provisions concerning Sizing: under B. Sizing specifications to be added:

3. Flat mushrooms

	Diameter of cap	
	Maximum length of stalk	
Size	Size limits	for cut mushrooms
Small	20-55 mm	25 mm
Large	over 55 mm	30 mm

- d) We would also like (iv) to be removed. Stating that sizing is compulsory for cut and uncut mushrooms in class II presented in packages weighing 1 kg or less.

- e) Section VI. Provisions concerning Marking: under B. Nature of produce, the word "flat" should be inserted after the second indent. i.e. "cut", "uncut" or "flat".
