This note presents the proposal by the delegation of the Netherlands to use in the standards the term "packages" only.

Presentation on packages Proposal of the Bureau to clarify/amend the Standard Layout 2009 (ECE/TRADE/C/WP.7/GE.1/2010/INF52)

The Netherlands would propose to use only one term in term package in the standards. In the Standard Layout the chapter `(C) presentation` of V. Provisions concerning presentations was deleted from the Standard Layout with the argumentation that the standards should not be to descriptive and should allow innovative ways of presenting the produce to the market. Standards are often following the developments on the market. The market is innovating and develops itself quickly, that's why a standard which is too prescriptive is always behind the market. The traders will sort out what is of interest and gives enough commercial value to invest in innovation.

We spend last year in Geneva a lot of time trying to define what the market wants in a specific type of package. The Netherlands propose to use ONLY the word **package** in the standards in all the various sections (sizing, provisions concerning presentation provisions concerning marking) for reasons of clarity and simplicity. For example, in the part of the standard of mixing of produce in one package, the most important part is the fact that the mixed varieties should be distinctly different. The requirement that the visible part of the content of the package should be representative for the entire content is sufficient tot ensure transparency of the market. Depending the business of the trader, operator, packer or seller, they might want to sell their produce to consumer, caterer, restaurant or another trader and use different type of packages, often depending on the prescriptions of the user.
