The Canadian regulations require that the name and address of the responsible party by or for whom the produce was grown or packaged to be marked on the package.

Request the name and address of the packer/exporter, however the telephone or fax number will also be accepted.

The code mark is accepted if the reference packer, dispatcher, exporter or equivalent term is indicated in close connection with this code mark.

- Malawi, through the Malawi Bureau of Standards operates an Import Quality Monitoring Scheme and a mandatory standard for the labelling of prepacked foods; MBS 19, both of which require an explicit marking of the name and address of the packer/exporter. The code mark may be a supplementary information.
- Code marks can be used but still the name and address of the packer/exporter are required in both the trade within the country and export.
- According to the Polish Regulation of the Minister of Agriculture of 15 July, 1994 on labelling of food products, stimulants and permitted additives intended for turnover (Official Journal No. 86, item 402) label should contain: 1. Name of product. 2. Net content / amount of pieces. 3. Name and address of producer/packer. 4. Country of origin. 5. Quality class.
