The Cost of Trade Documentation

In a report by UNECE, it is estimated that the cost of trade documentation is approximately 5%-10% of the cost of goods produced.

The Need to Reduce Cost of Trade Documentation



The Revised Kyoto Convention, Standard 3.12, General Annex – Chapter 3

“Clearance and Customs formalities”, stipulates “The Customs shall limit the data required in the Goods declaration to only such particulars as are deemed necessary for the assessment and collection of duties and taxes, the compilation of statistics and the application of Customs law”.

The Recommendation No.18 of the United Nations Centre for Trade Facilitation and Electronic Business (UN/CEFACT)

“Facilitation Measures Related to International Trade procedures” recommends that sellers and buyers should align all relevant inhouse documents to the United Nations Layout Key for Trade Documents. It suggests that government authorities should require a minimum data and documents for control purposes and, where possible, utilize commercial information. It is proposed that Governments should request import and export data only once and should allow the submission of data to a single entity.

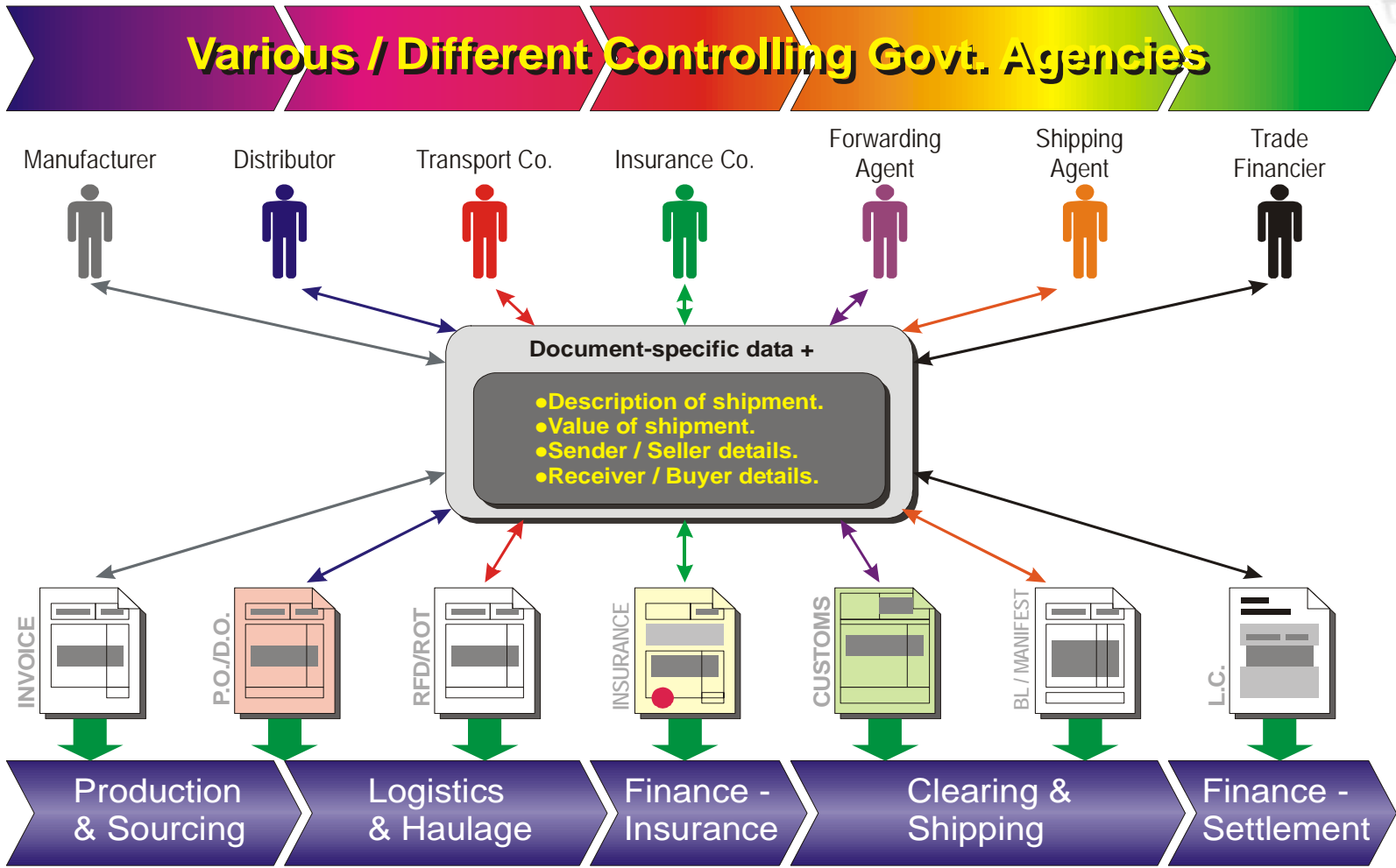
DEFINITION OF ASEAN SINGLE WINDOW



Definition of the ASEAN Single Window: *For the purpose of the Agreement, the **ASEAN Single Window** is defined as the environment where national Single Windows operate and integrate. Functions and roles of a National Single Window are based on a single submission of data and information, of a single and synchronous processing of data and information and a single decision making for customs release and clearance. A single decision-making is uniformly interpreted as a single point of decision for the release of cargoes by the Customs on the basis of decisions taken by line ministries and communicated timely to the Customs."*

Extracted from the earlier draft version of the agreement signed by the ASEAN Economic Ministers in the 11th ASEAN Summit, Kuala Lumpur, December 2005

Lateral Data Flow Across Traditional Vertical Industry Cultures / Common Data Flowing Through A Segmented (Disjointed) Value Chain

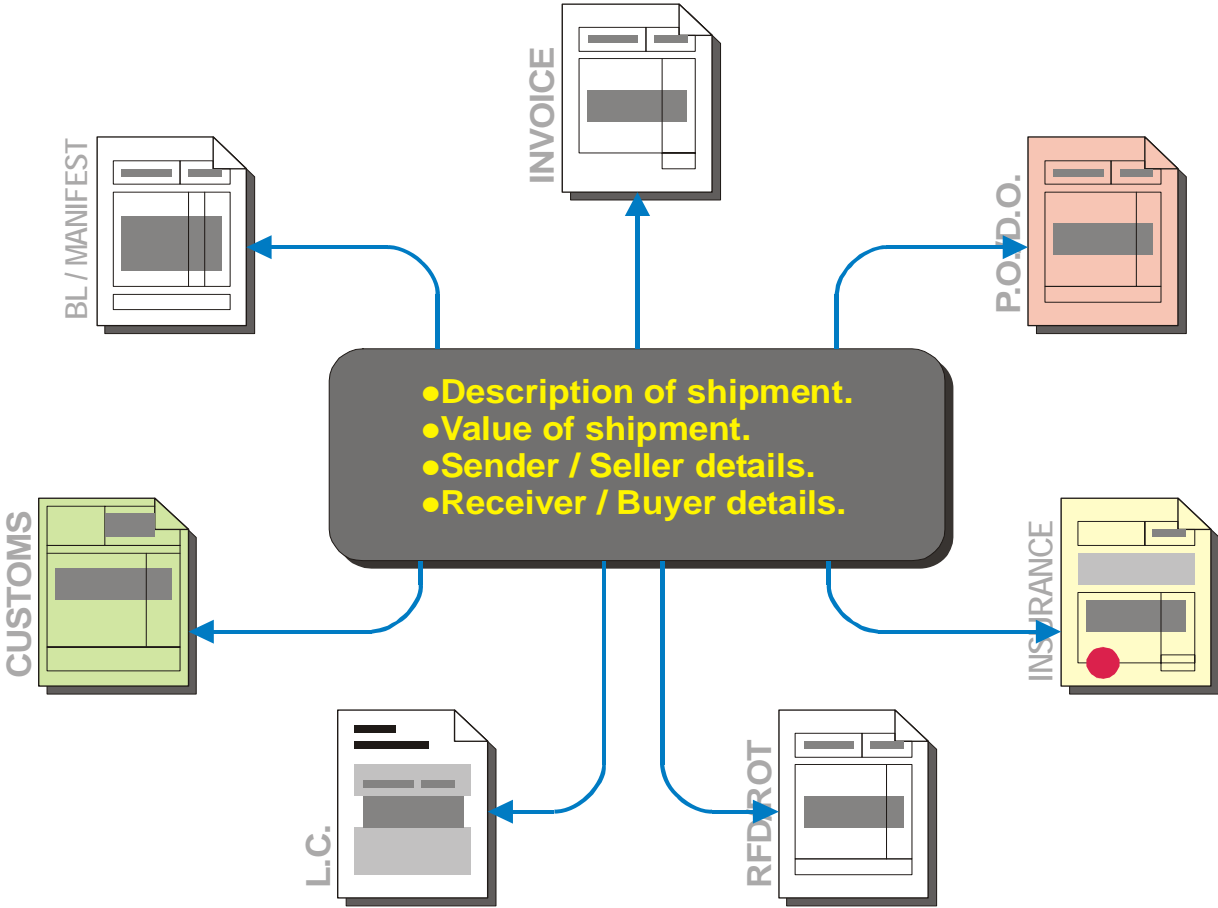


Common Data in Trade Value Chain

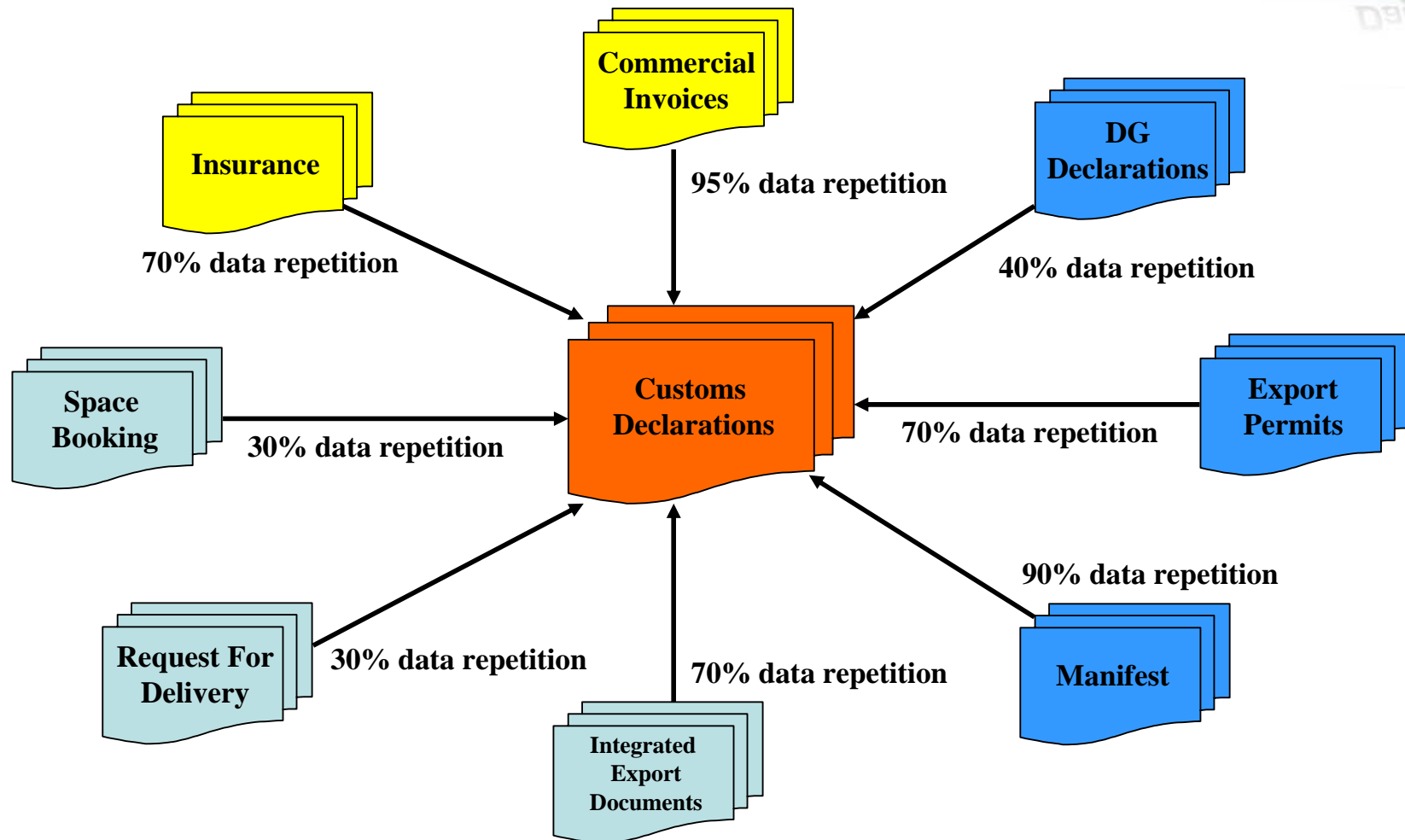

e-Commerce, e-Business...they all have similar meanings...where one party “sells” and one party “buys”....

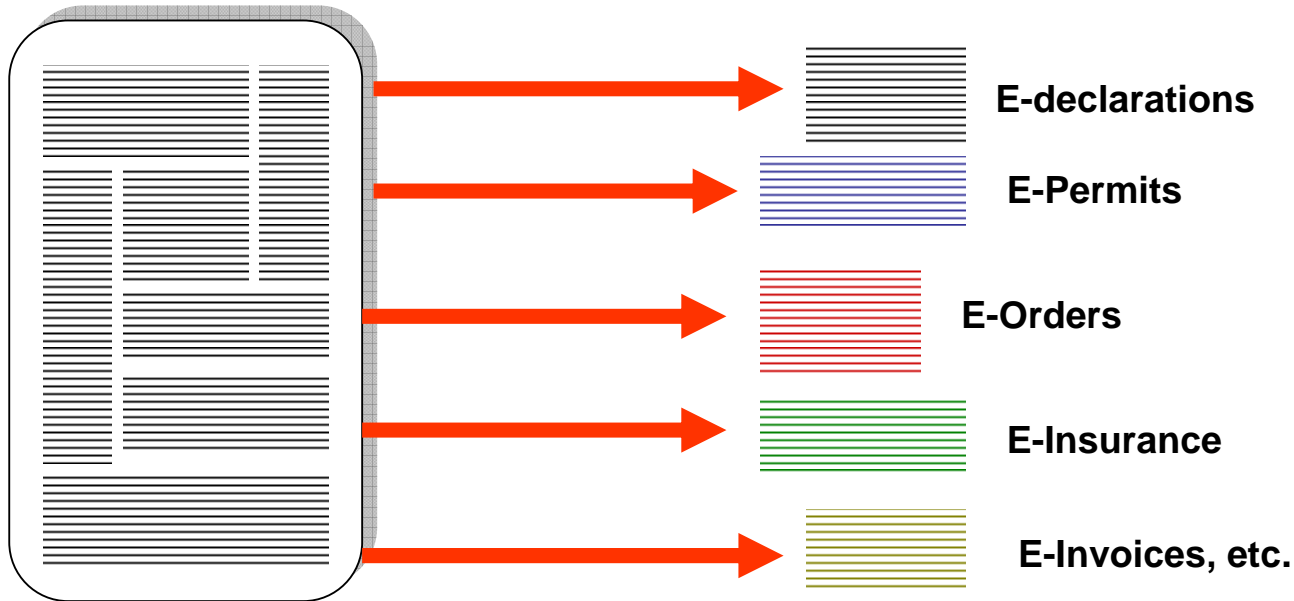
Trade Facilitation is a chain of activities where it involves the processes of applications and declarations pertaining to the movement of goods from “seller” to “buyer” and ultimately concluding with a payment transaction.

e-Trade Facilitation is the re-engineering and simplification of traditional and conventional trade facilitation chains of activities with the usage of computing and communications technology, whilst improving the efficient and effectiveness of the process & protecting the integrity and accuracy of data.

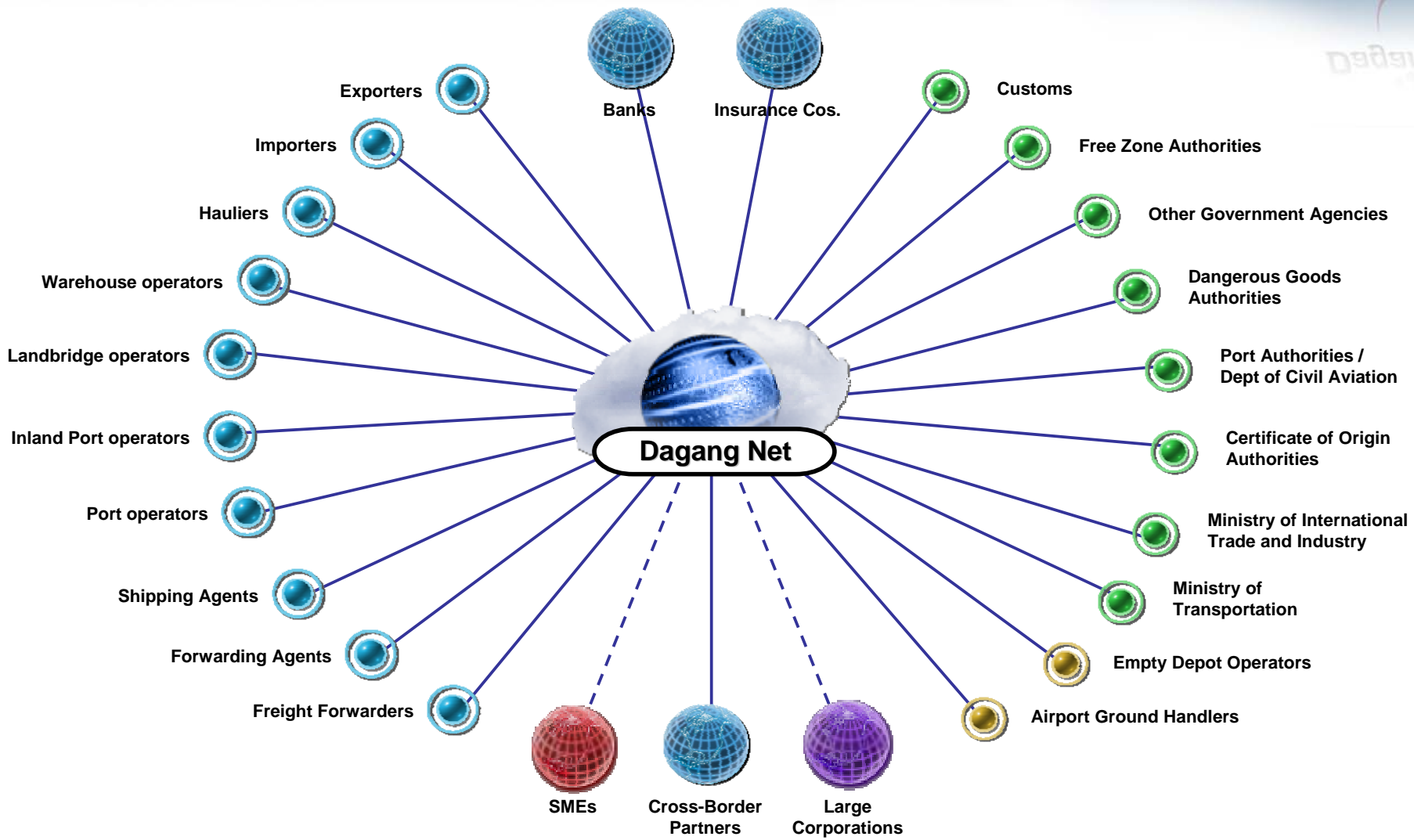

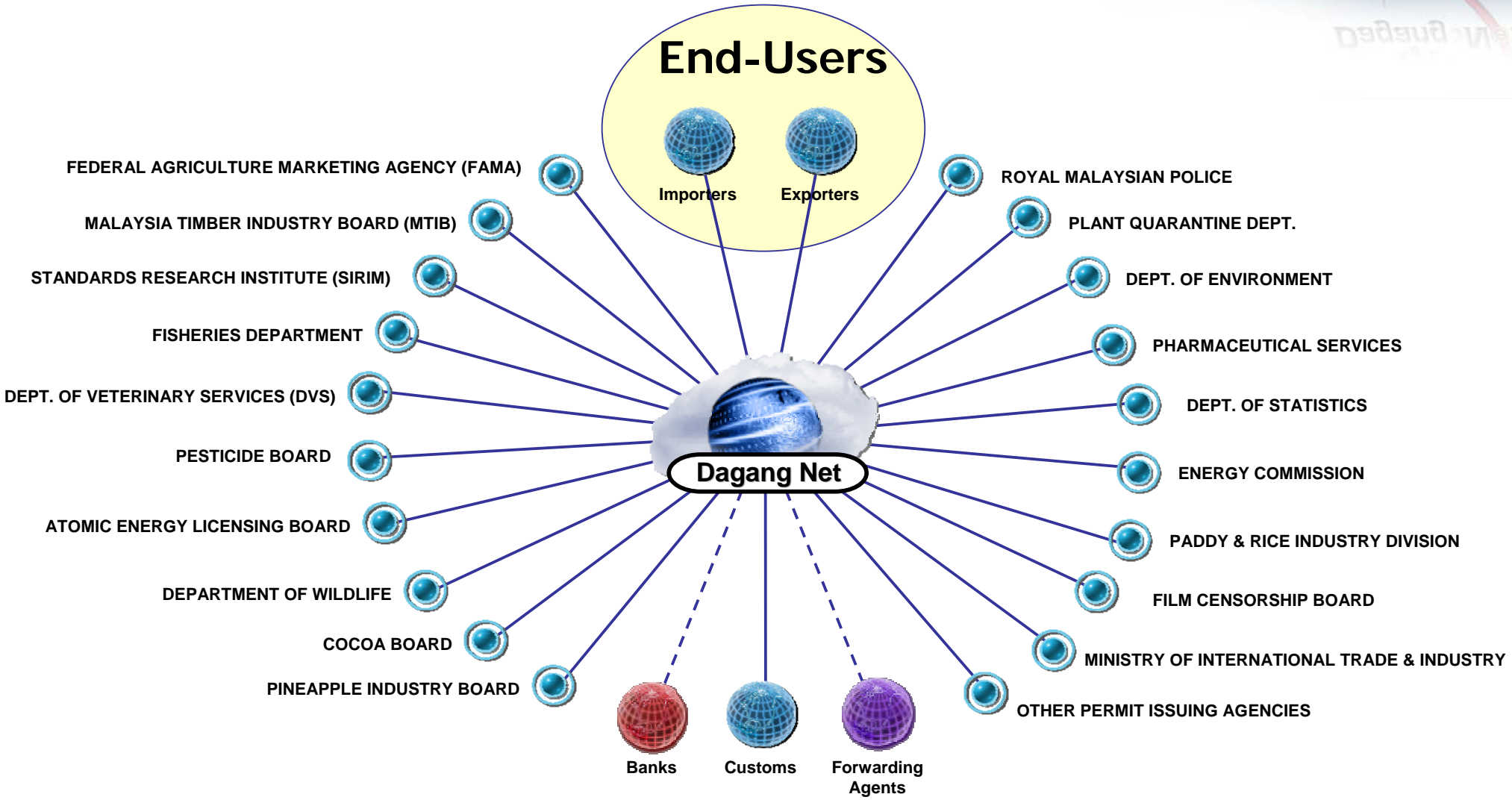

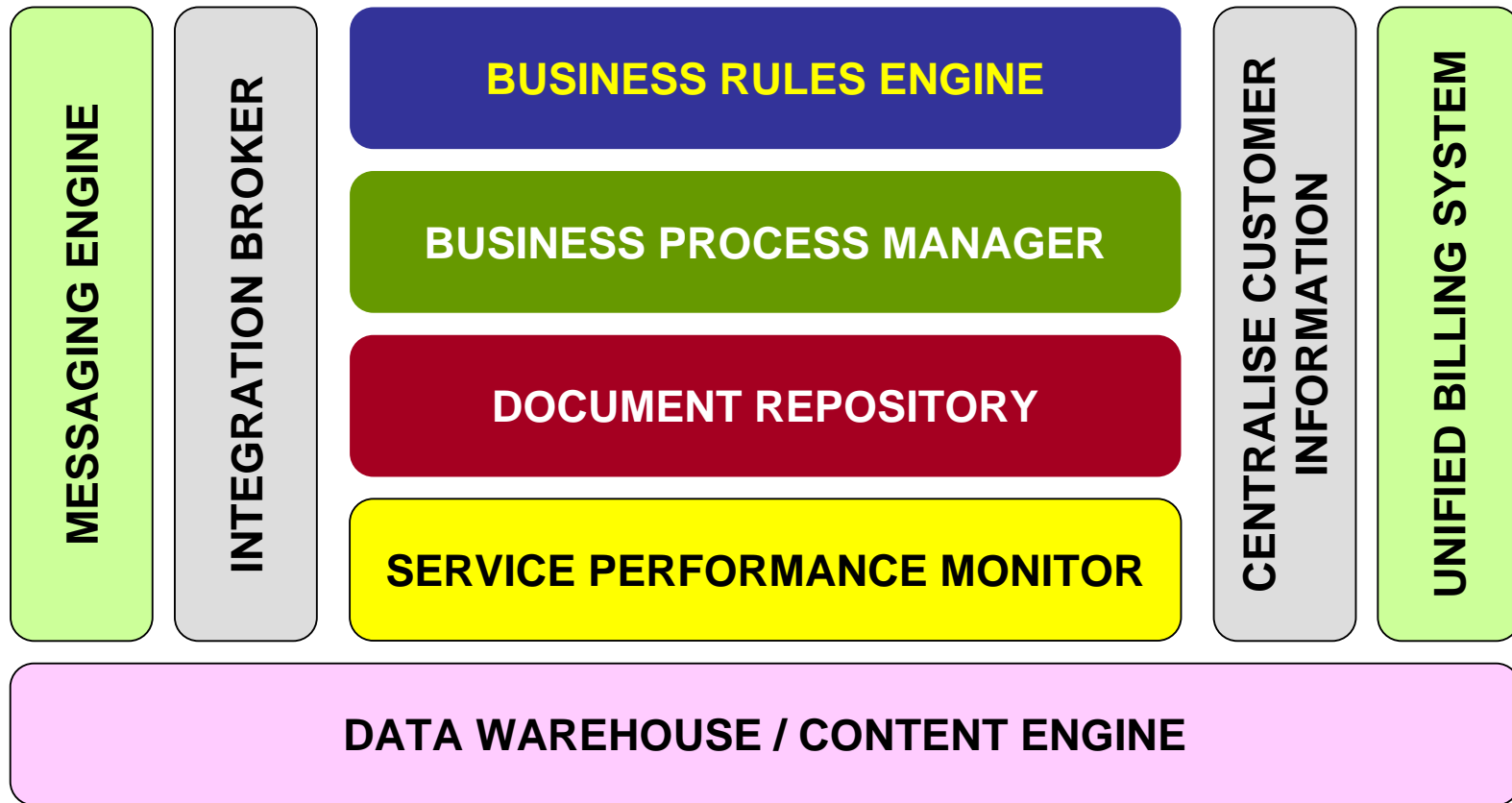
ePermit's Web of "Single Window"

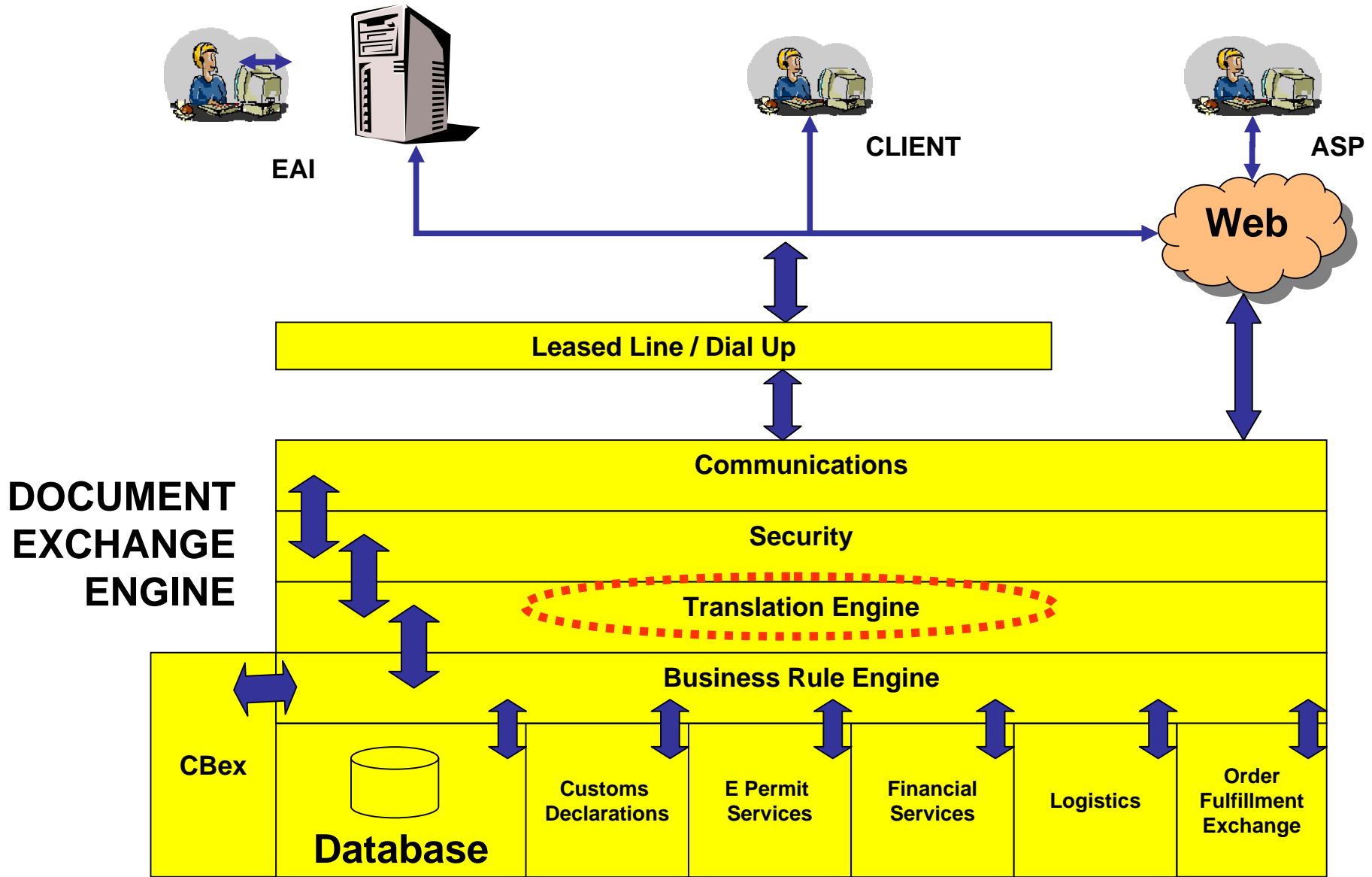

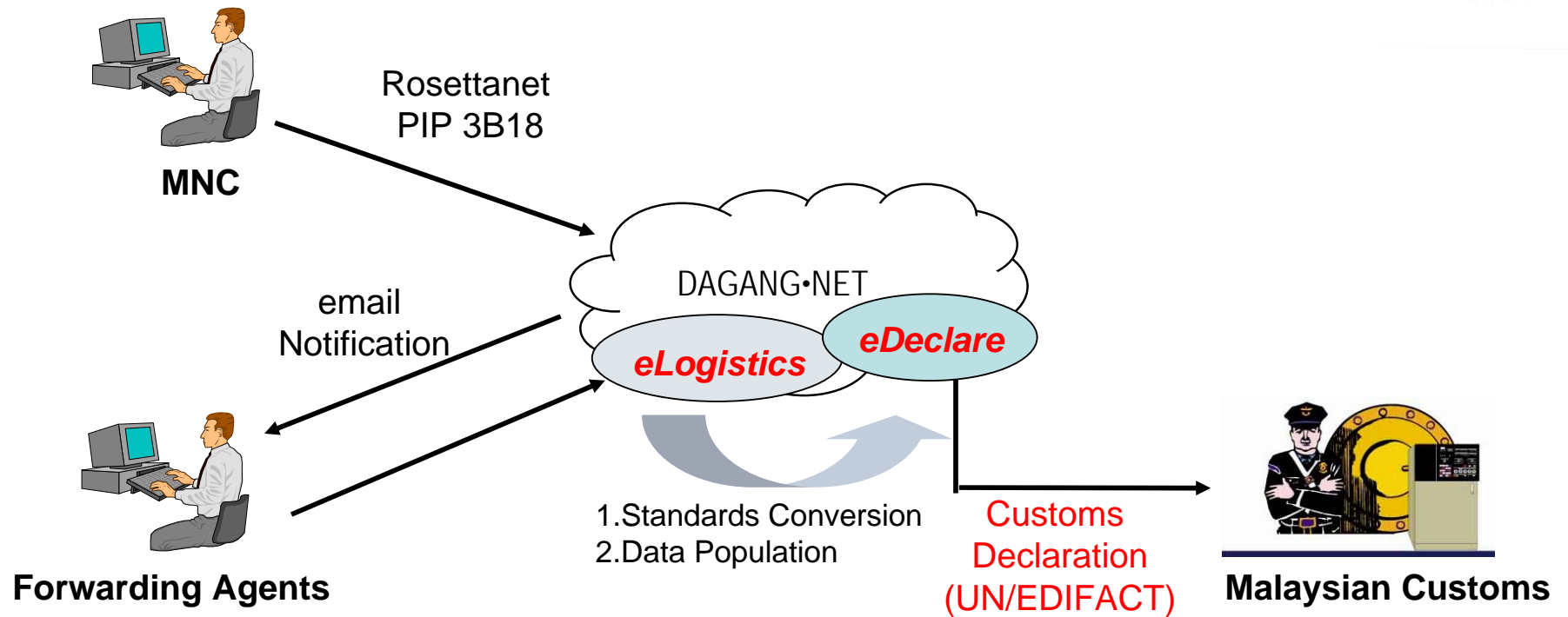
The *Document Engine* of Dagang Net Exchange (DNX)



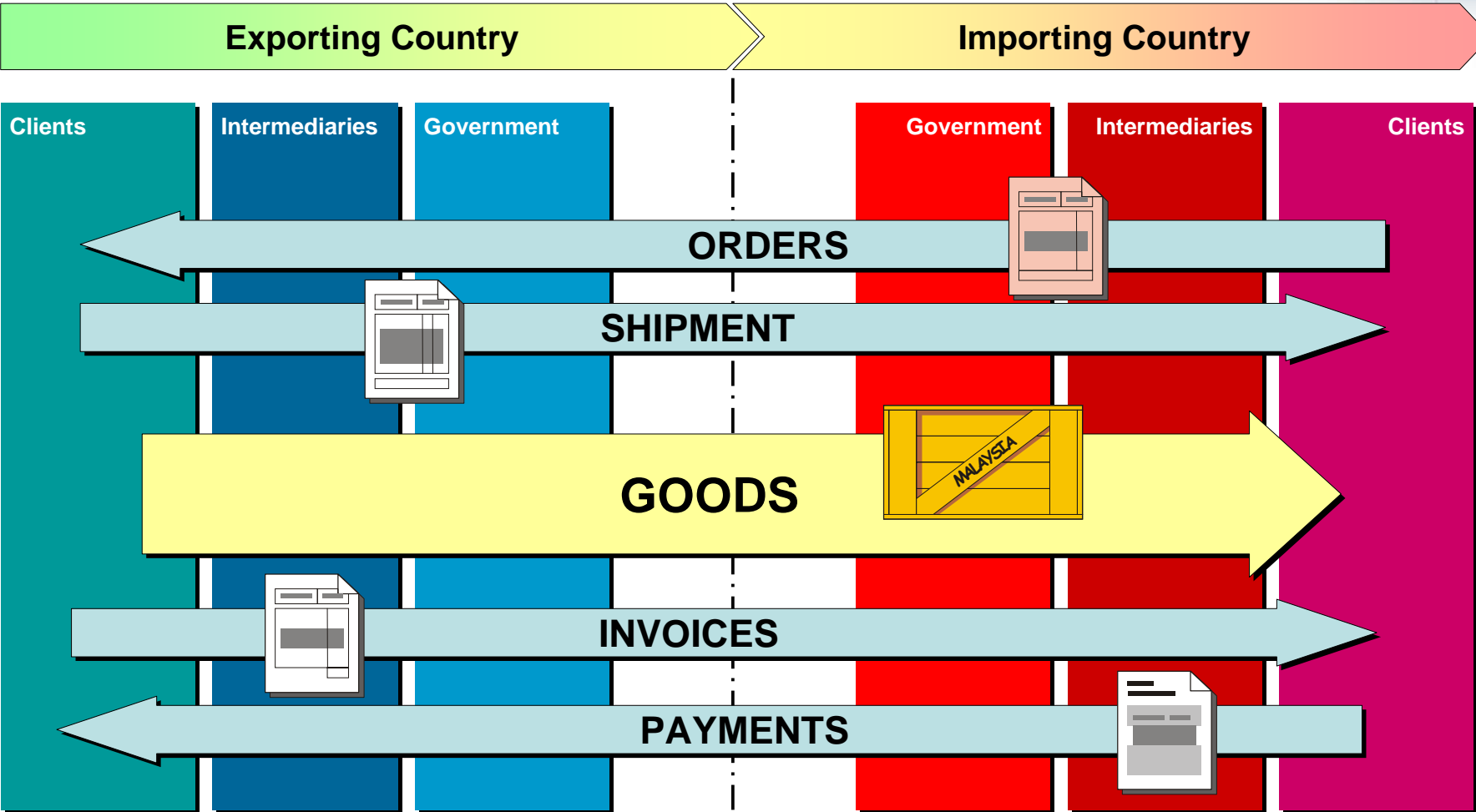


Document Exchange Engine

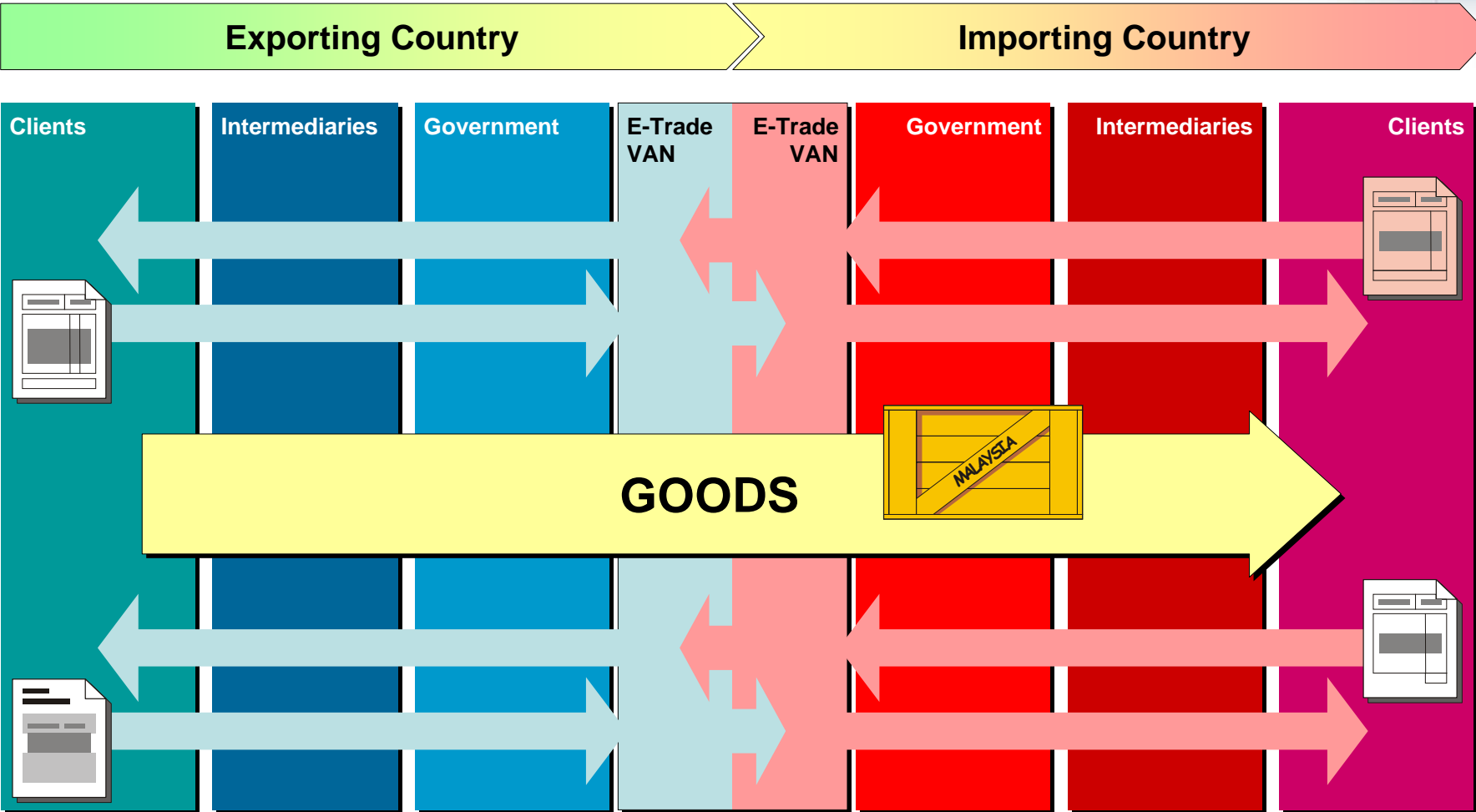

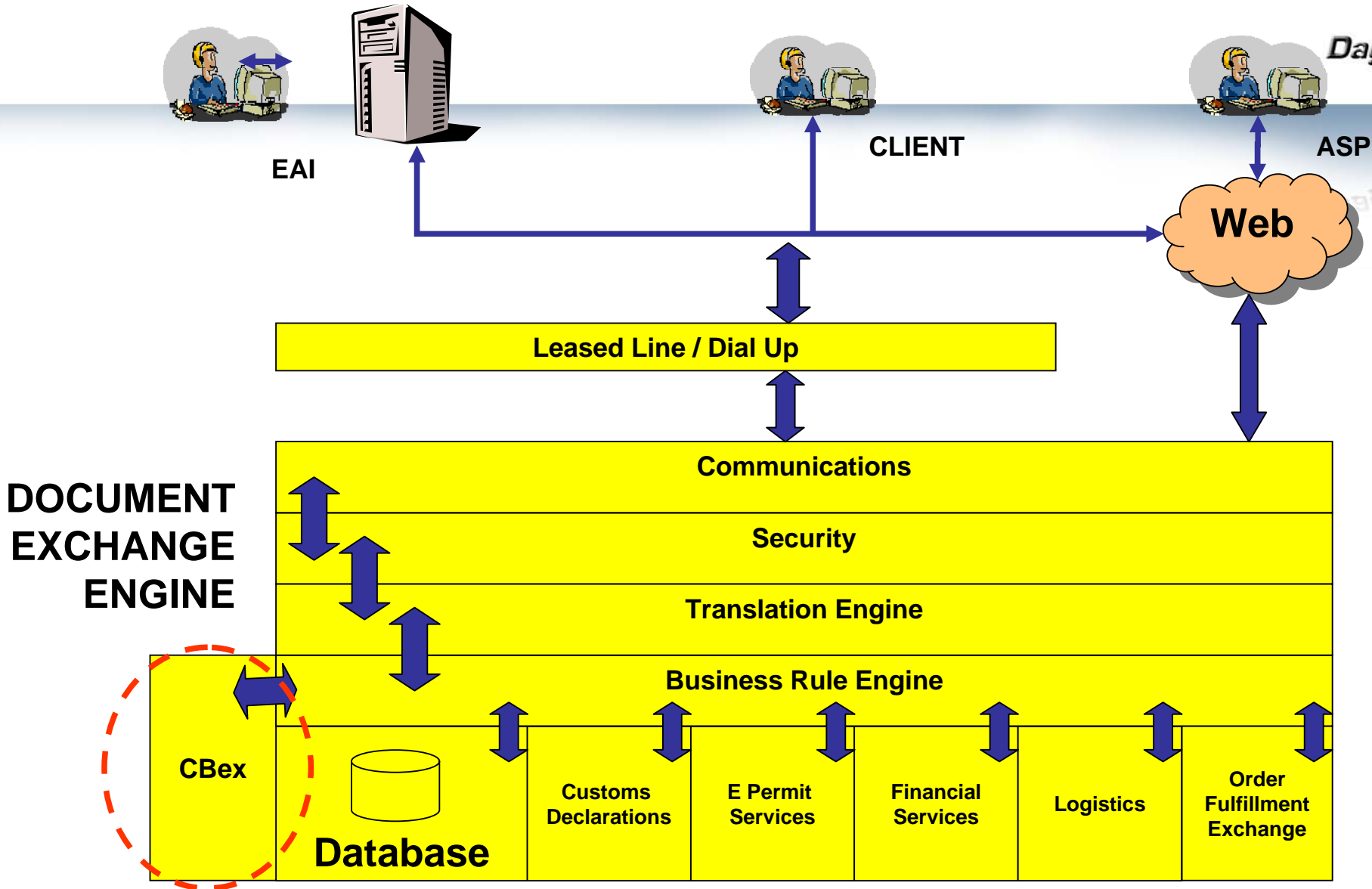


Overview of Cross-Border Trade Flow



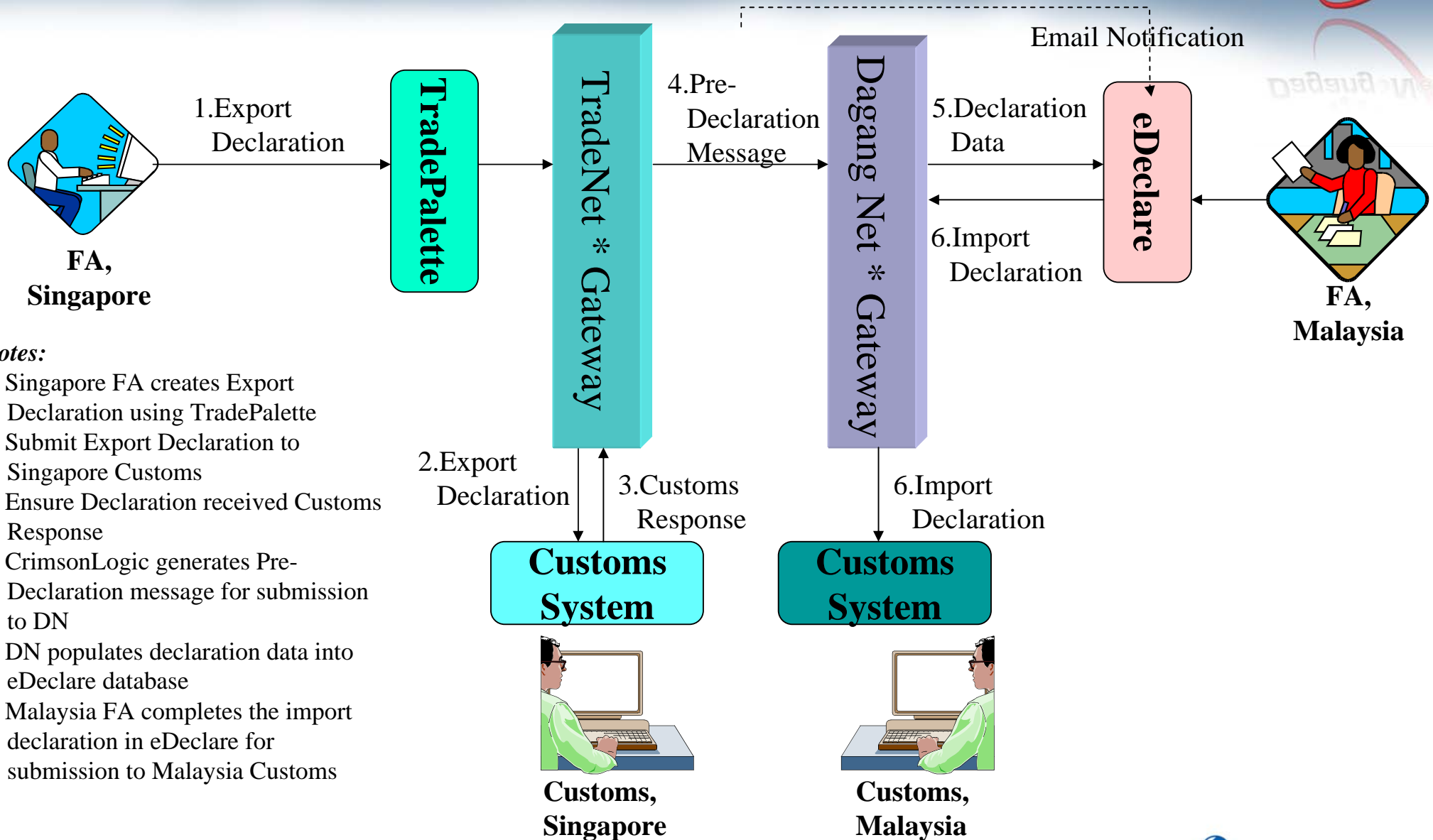
Cross-Border Information Collaboration: Aggregating the Chain Across Borders

Phase 1 : Export Singapore, Import Malaysia



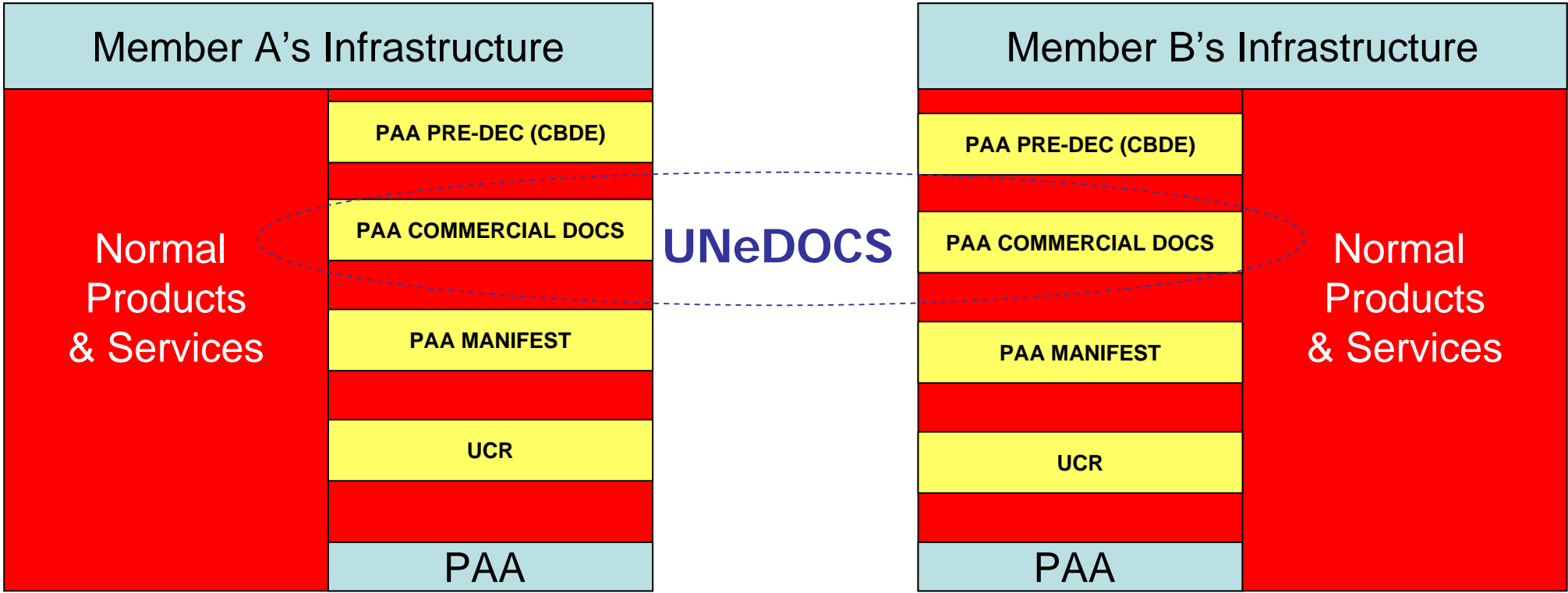
Notes:

1. Singapore FA creates Export Declaration using TradePalette
2. Submit Export Declaration to Singapore Customs
3. Ensure Declaration received Customs Response
4. CrimsonLogic generates Pre-Declaration message for submission to DN
5. DN populates declaration data into eDeclare database
6. Malaysia FA completes the import declaration in eDeclare for submission to Malaysia Customs

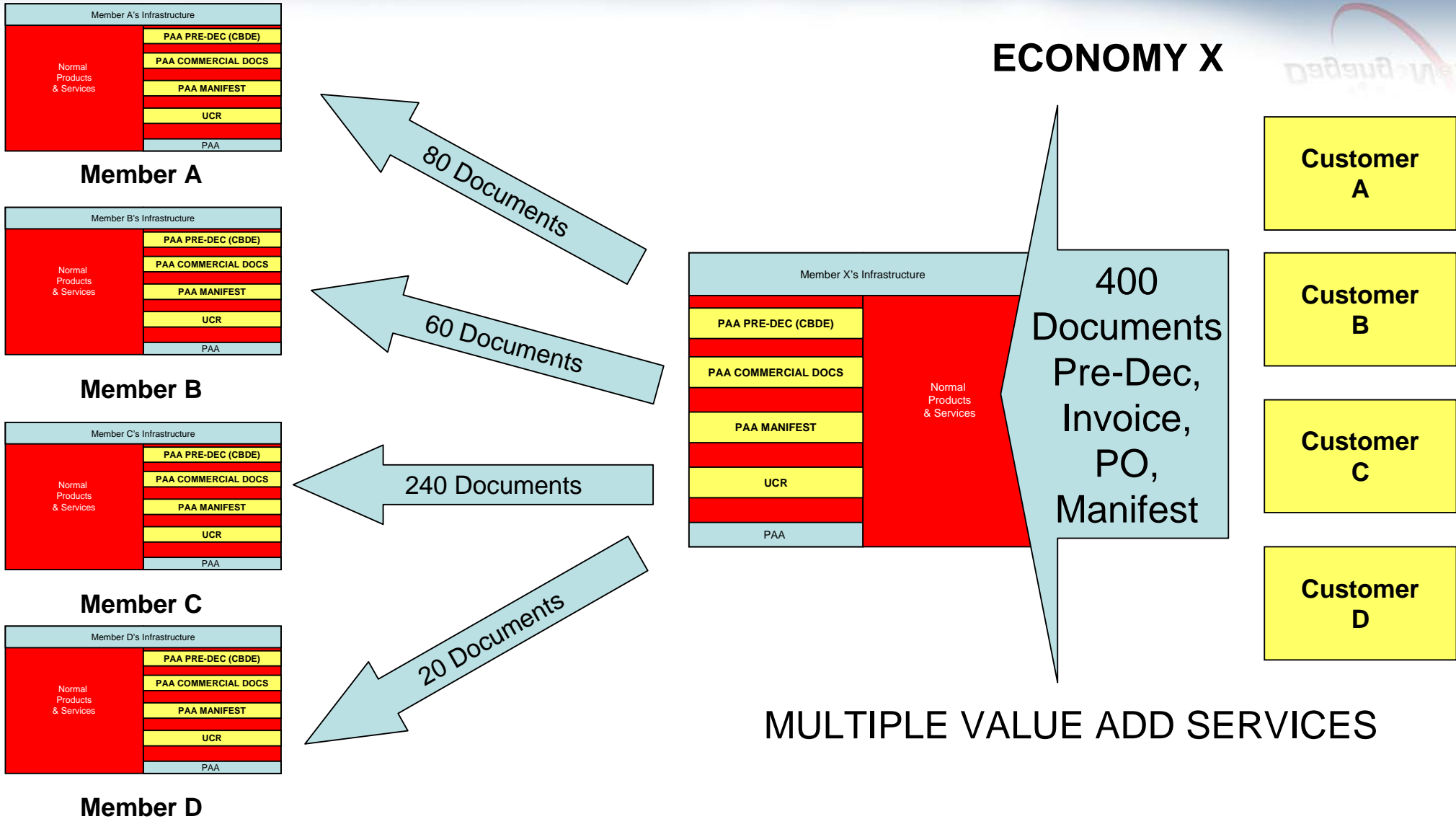
