A. ACEM Commitment on the adoption of an automatic headlamp on specification

The motorcycle and moped manufacturers represented by ACEM have adopted the following commitment:

"Starting from 2002, we, the Powered Two-Wheeler (PTW) manufacturers represented by ACEM, will begin to introduce on the market models fitted with Automatic Headlamp On.

By June 17^{th} 2003 all new vehicles will comply with that specification.

The Automatic Headlamp On (AHO) specification means that the headlamp will be lit as soon as the engine is started.

- 1. The conspicuity of PTWs is likely to be improved.
- 2. A growing number of countries require PTWs to be used with their headlamps on at all times and therefore there will be a cost-saving through specification harmonisation and simplification of switch-gear " $\,$
