In view of the Working Party's decisions at its last session (see TRANS/WP.15/165, paras. 76 to 86), an ad hoc group of experts is scheduled to meet in parallel from 5 November (p.m.) to 8 November to consider questions relating to CRTD. The secretariat has arranged for simultaneous interpretation to be available.

1. **Adoption of the agenda**

In accordance with the Commission's rules of procedure, the first item on the provisional agenda is the adoption of the agenda.

2. Status of the European Agreement concerning the International Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Road (ADR) and related issues

(a) Status of the Agreement

With the accession of Kazakhstan (26 July 2001) and Morocco (1 June 2001), the number of Contracting Parties to ADR has risen to 38. The list of competent authorities and their particulars can be found in document TRANS/WP.15/2001/8, -/Corr.1 and -/Corr.2.

(b) Protocol of amendment of 1993

The entry into force of the Protocol amending articles 1 (a), 14 (1) and 14 (3) (b) of ADR, adopted at Geneva on 28 October 1993 (depositary notification C.N.448.1993-TREATIES-2) requires the deposit of instruments of ratification, acceptance, approval and accession, as appropriate, of all Contracting Parties to ADR. To date 24 States are Contracting Parties to the Protocol but the 14 States named below have not yet deposited the instruments in question:

Azerbaijan, Belarus, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Germany, Greece, Kazakhstan, Lithuania, Morocco, the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Republic of Moldova, Ukraine and Yugoslavia.

(c) Special agreements

The consolidated list of special agreements (updated to 1 February 2001) was published under the symbol TRANS/WP.15/2001/16. Contracting Parties to ADR are informed quarterly

of new agreements and revocations. Information on multilateral agreements (text and list of contracting States) may be obtained on the Transport Division's Web site (http://www.unece.org/trans/danger/danger.htm).

(d) Notifications in accordance with marginal 10 599

The Working Party will be informed of any notifications communicated by the Contracting Parties to ADR. These notifications may now be consulted on the Transport Division's Web site (www.unece.org/trans/danger/danger.htm).

4. Safety in road tunnels

This question was discussed at the two previous sessions (see TRANS/WP.15/163, paras. 65 to 71 and TRANS/WP.15/165, paras. 73 to 75) and it was decided to keep it on the agenda for 2001. No new proposals have been submitted to date.

5. Follow-up of the Convention on Civil Liability for Damage caused during Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Road, Rail and Inland Navigation Vessels (CRTD)

The Inland Transport Committee at its sixty-third session (13-15 February 2001) requested the Working Party to consider the results of a questionnaire on the CRTD Convention, and, if it deemed appropriate, establish an ad hoc group of experts to consider how the Convention could be modified to encourage accessions. The Working Party decided to schedule for the forthcoming session a parallel session of an ad hoc group of experts to consider the question and, in the light of the replies to the questionnaire, formulate recommendations to the Inland Transport Committee on the course to follow.
