Special provision for vessels with an IMO number

Maritime vessels with an IMO number may only be assigned with an European Unique ID, when the vessel is equipped with an additional certificate for inland navigation (e.g. certificate in accordance with the directive 82/714/EG revised of the European Union or the Rhine Inspection Rules). The European Unique ID consists of the number 9 followed by the IMO number in this case.

Transitional provision for vessels with a Rhine vessel number

Hulls, which have already a valid 7 digit vessel number in accordance with the Rhine Inspection Rules at the date of application, are assigned with an European Unique ID consisting of the number 0 followed by the vessel number.
