PROPOSAL FOR DRAFT SUPPLEMENT 12 TO THE 02 SERIES OF AMENDMENTS TO REGULATION No. 48

(Installation of lighting and light-signalling devices)

Paragraph 2.7.12., amend to read:

"2.7.12. "<u>Stop lamp</u>" means a lamp used to indicate to other road users to the rear of the vehicle that the longitudinal movement of the vehicle is intentionally retarded."

Paragraph 6.7.7., amend to read:

- "6.7.7. <u>Electrical connections</u>
- 6.7.7.1. All stop lamps must light up simultaneously when the braking system provides the relevant signal defined in Regulations Nos. 13 and 13-H.
- 6.7.7.2. The stop lamps need not function if the device, which starts and/or stops the engine, is in a position that makes it impossible for the engine to operate."
