**PROGRAMME OF WORK FOR THE BIENNIUM 2007-2008**

Transmitted by the expert from the United Kingdom

1. Whilst it is open for all participants in the Sub-Committee to submit papers for consideration at any session of the biennium, the expert of the United Kingdom believes that it is helpful to identify the key priorities for the Work Programme for the forthcoming biennium.
  2. To that end the expert from the United Kingdom proposes that the following work items, in no particular order, should be accorded the greatest priority over the forthcoming biennium:
    - Further measures to facilitate global harmonization of transport of dangerous goods regulations with the UN Model Regulations;
    - Editorial review of Part 6 of the Model regulations and its possible transfer to Part 4 and the Manual of Tests and Criteria;
    - Further measures to facilitate the harmonization of IAEA regulations for the safe transport of radioactive material with the UN Model Regulations;
    - Measures to enhance multi-modal harmonization of measures regulating the transport of dangerous goods packed in limited quantities;
    - Provisions for the safe transport of fumigated freight containers and dry ice;
    - The impact of E-freight on documentation requirements and other provisions in the Model Regulations;
    - Provisions for the transport of dangerous goods in open cryogenic receptacles.
