Note by the secretariat

I. INTRODUCTION

1. The Working Party on Inland Water Transport (SC.3) at its fiftieth session asked the Working Party on the Standardization of Technical and Safety Requirements in Inland Navigation (SC.3/WP.3) to prepare amendments to section 2-7 "official number" in order to harmonize its content with the forthcoming provisions on unique European Identification Number of the EC Directive 2006/87/06 (ECE/TRANS/SC.3/174, para. 39). During its thirty-first session in June 2007, SC.3/WP.3 took note of the latest proposal on the revision of Articles 2.17 and 2.18 of the Directive under consideration by the EU member states and asked the

secretariat to prepare, based on the proposal, a draft of the revised section 2.7 for the SC.3 fifty-first session (ECE/TRANS/SC.3/WP.3/62, para.19).

2. At its fifty-first session, the Working Party on Inland Water Transport considered the draft (ECE/TRANS/SC.3/2007/3), noting that the proposed amendments to the EC Directive 2006/87/EC had not yet been adopted. It also discussed whether the official number should remain invariable throughout the existence of the vessel with no exception, which would entail deleting the second and the third phrases in point 2-7.3. The Working Party on Inland Water Transport asked SC.3/WP.3 to reconsider these draft changes to section 2-7 with particular attention to point 2-7.3 and to prepare a new document for its next session (ECE/TRANS/SC.3/178, para. 17).

3. SC.3/WP.3 may wish to consider the draft changes to section 2-7, proposed in part II of this document, which were prepared on the basis of the comments regarding point 2-7.3 received from Governments. In doing so, it may also wish to take note of the latest proposal of the requirements of Annex II of the Directive and of the Rhine Vessel Inspection Regulation concerning the European vessel number, prepared by the EC/CCNR Joint Working Group, reproduced in the annex to the document.

4. The proposal to rename section 2-7 as "Unique European Identification Number" in order to ensure consistency with other international documents on this subject, approved at the thirty-second session of SC.3/WP.3 (ECE/TRANS/SC.3/WP.3/64, para.10), has been incorporated in the document. Additional comments from Governments regarding point 2-7.3 are presented in document ECE/TRANS/SC.3/WP.3/2008/18.

II. DRAFT AMENDMENTS TO SECTION 2-7

5. To <u>modify</u> section 2-7 "Official Number" as follows (Additions to the original text are highlighted in bold and the text to eliminate is highlighted in strike-through):

"2-7 UNIQUE EUROPEAN IDENTIFICATION OFFICIAL NUMBER

2-7.1 The competent authority issuing a certificate shall enter on that certificate the official number assigned to that vessel by the competent authority of the State in which the vessel has been registered or has its home port.

2-7.2 The official number shall consist of eight Arabic numerals, as follows:

The first two or three digits shall indicate the country and place where the official number was assigned competent authority of the State in which the vessel has been registered or has its home port and which assigned the number. For this purpose the following key shall apply:

The next five or six digits of the official number shall indicate the serial number in the register kept by the competent authority.

2-7.3 The official number shall remain invariable throughout the existence of the vessel. However, if that vessel is registered in another State or if its home port is transferred there, the official number shall no longer be valid. The ship's certificate shall then be submitted to a competent authority on the inspection of vessels which shall delete the official number that has ceased to be valid and, if necessary, shall enter the new official number."

THE AGREED TEXT^{1/} FOR THE REQUIREMENTS OF ANNEX II OF THE DIRECTIVE AND OF THE RHINE VESSEL INSPECTION REGULATION CONCERNING THE EUROPEAN VESSEL NUMBER ACCORDING TO THE DISCUSSIONS IN THE CCNR/EC JOINT WORKING GROUP MEETING OF 29 OCTOBER 2007

Annex II of the European Directive on Technical Provisions for Inland navigation Vessels

1. Articles 2.17 and 2.18 are to be changed as follows:

"Article 2.17

Register of Community certificates

1. Competent authorities shall assign an order number to the Community certificates they issue.

They shall keep a register in accordance with the model set out in Annex VI of all the Community certificates they issue.

- 2. Competent authorities shall keep the original, or a copy of all the Community certificates they have issued, shall enter on these any information and alterations, together with any Community certificate cancellations and replacements, and shall update the register set out in section 1 accordingly.
- 3. In order to perform administrative measures for maintaining safety and ease of navigation and for implementation of Articles 2.02 to 2.15 read only access to the register in accordance with the model set out in Annex VI will be granted to competent authorities of other Member States, Contracting States of the Mannheim Convention and, as far as an equivalent level of privacy is guaranteed, to third countries on the basis of administrative agreements.

Article **2.18**

European Vessel Identification Number

- 1. The unique European Vessel Identification Number (ENI), in the following referred to as European Vessel Identification Number, consists of eight Arabic numerals according to Appendix III.
- 2. The competent authority having issued a Community certificate shall enter on that Community certificate the European Vessel Identification Number. Unless the craft possesses a European Vessel Identification Number at the time of issue of the Community Certificate it shall be assigned to that craft by the competent authority of the Member State in which the craft has been registered or has its home port.

As far as craft from countries where an assignation of a European Vessel Identification Number is not possible are concerned the European Vessel Identification Number to be entered on the Community certificate shall be assigned by the competent authority issuing that Community certificate.

- 3. Only one single European Vessel Identification Number can be assigned to one craft. The European Vessel Identification Number is issued only once and remains unchanged throughout the whole lifetime of the craft.
- 4. The owner of a craft, or his representative, shall apply to the competent authorities for assignment of the European Vessel Identification Number. The owner or his representative shall also be responsible for affixing the European Vessel Identification Number entered in the Community certificate to the craft.
- 5. The Member States shall notify the competent authorities responsible for assigning the European Vessel Identification Number to the European Commission. The European Commission keeps a register of competent authorities, including competent authorities notified by third countries, and makes it available to the Member States. On request this register is also made available to competent authorities of third countries.
- 6. The competent authorities responsible for assigning the European Vessel Identification Number make all necessary arrangements in order to inform all competent authorities responsible for assigning the European Vessel Identification Number of each newly assigned European Vessel Identification Number as well of data necessary for the identification of the vessel in accordance with Appendix IV. These data may be made available to competent authorities of other Member States, Contracting States of the Mannheim Convention and, as far as an equivalent level of privacy is guaranteed, to third countries on the basis of administrative agreements in order to perform administrative measures for maintaining safety and ease of navigation and for implementation of Articles 2.02 to 2.15 and Article 2.18 section 3."

2. After Appendix II a new Appendix III is inserted as follows:
