 $\frac{4}{2}$ Concerning phase 2, AC.3 agreed that once the gtr is established, a mandate will be given to the Flex-TEG group as an informal group to develop phase 2 of the gtr under the chairmanship of Japan. It would be also considered a proposal aimed at introducing a tolerance on the geometric criteria that determine the exemption of flat front vehicles.

SUBJECTS AS AN EXCHANGE OF VIEWS TO DEVELOP GTRS ON JUNE 2008

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1/ AC.3 agreed to revisit the priority of this subject at its next session

2/ AC.3 agreed to take a decision at its November 2008 session on the discontinuation of this agenda item.

3/ GRRF agreed to suspend the development of a draft gtr on passenger vehicle braking at its September 2008 session.

4/ AC.3 agreed to take a decision on this at the November 2008 session on the further development of this subject, taking into consideration the information transmitted by GRSG.

5/ No activity at the present time by the informal group on gtr No. 5, awaiting the adoption of the ISO standard regarding Ethernet based wired communication.

 $\underline{6}$ AC.3 noted the informal group's intention to anticipate the completion of the road map in 2009. The representatives of the EC and the United States of America were urged to define their position.

 $\frac{7}{1}$ AC.3 noted that an informal group was established to update UNECE Regulation No. 94 (frontal impact). The AC.3 Chairperson stated that the informal group and USA joint efforts could even result in the development of a gtr on crash compatibility in the area of frontal impact.

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
