Draft programme of work and biennial evaluation for 2014–2015

Note by the secretariat

I. Mandate

1. In accordance with the decision of the Inland Transport Committee (ITC) to review its programme of work every two years, the next review being 2014 (ECE/TRANS/200, para. 120), the Working Party will be invited to review and adopt its programme of work for 2014–2015 as well as the relevant parameters for its biennial evaluation.

2. The present document contains the draft programme of work for 2014–2015, relevant parameters for its biennial evaluation and information on the status of the Working Party.

II. Draft programme of work for 2014–2015

A. Introduction

3. The present document sets out the draft programme of work for 2014–2015 of ITCs subprogramme relating to "Intermodal Transport and Logistics". The Working Party on Intermodal Transport and Logistics (WP.24) is invited to consider this programme for adoption at its current session. It will then be submitted to ITC and the UNECE Executive Committee for formal approval. The Working Party and the ITC will have the opportunity to adjust its programme of work during the course of the biennium, to be reflected in a separate document.



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4. The draft programme of work applies a results-based approach. It comprises, for each cluster of activities, an expected accomplishment and a list of outputs/activities proposed to be carried out in 2014–2015. The delivery of these outputs/activities is expected to contribute to achieving the expected results.

5. The grouping of programme activities into clusters is the same as that used by the ITC for the biennial evaluation of its subprogramme performance.

6. The following clusters of activities make up the UNECE's subprogramme on transport (ECE/TRANS/2012/9/Rev.1):

7. Furthermore, the outputs/activities listed in this document correspond with the UNECE programme budget for 2014–2015, subprogramme 2: Transport adopted by the General Assembly (A/68/6 (Section 20)). As necessary, they are complemented by additional items to reflect more recent developments and needs of UNECE member States. For easy reference, such new outputs/activities are clearly indicated as "additional".

8. The outputs/activities have been listed under the cluster of activities to which they belong according to the following main categories: (a) meetings and related parliamentary documentation; (b) publications and other information material; and (c) technical cooperation, including, seminars, workshops, training sessions, advisory services.

9. The relevant indicators of achievement, together with baseline and target data, against which performance will be measured, are presented below.

10. The present document is based in substance on the WP.24 work plan 2012–2016 as adopted by the fifty-fourth session of the Working Party in November 2011 (ECE/TRANS/WP24/2011/8, ECE/TRANS/WP.24/2011/7, ECE/TRANS/WP.24/129,

paras. 67–69) and approved by the ITC at its seventy-fourth session on 28 February–1 March 2012 (ECE/TRANS/2012/9, ECE/TRANS/224, para. 93).

B. Objective and strategy

11. The objective of the UNECE subprogramme of transport is to facilitate the international movement of persons and goods by inland transport modes and improve safety, environmental protection, energy efficiency and security in the transport sector to levels that contribute effectively to sustainable transport.

12. The responsibility for this subprogramme is vested in the Transport Division.

C. Outputs/activities to be delivered in the 2014–2015 biennium

13. Outputs/activities to be delivered in the 2014–2015 biennium are as follows:

III. Biennial evaluation

14. On the basis of decisions taken at its fifty-second session in November 2011 (ECE/TRANS/WP.24/129, para. 67), the activities of the Working Party are measured, as part of the biennial evaluation, against one expected accomplishment, three indicators of achievement and corresponding actual performance measures. In 2012 and 2013, this approach had been approved by the ITC as part of the performance planning for evaluation of the biennium 2012–2013 (ECE/TRANS/2012/10/Rev.1).

15. The Working Party may wish to review the 2012–2013 parameters (expected accomplishments, indicators of achievement, actual performance measures as provided below with a view to either maintaining them or establishing new ones for the biennium 2014–2015.

IV. Status of the Working Party

16. In accordance with the guidelines for the establishment and functioning of Working Parties within UNECE, the mandate and extension of these Working Parties should be reviewed every 5 years (ECE/EX/1, para. 1 (c)). The ITC, at its seventy-fourth session in March 2012, renewed the 5-year mandate of the Working Party (ECE/TRANS/224, para. 91) which was subsequently approved by the Commission at its sixty-fifth session in April 2013 (...⁵).

The terms of reference of the Working Party, adopted by the Working Party on 3 November 2011 (ECE/TRANS/WP.24/129, para. 71) and approved by the ITC on 1 March 2012 (ECE/TRANS/224, para. 91), are contained in document ECE/TRANS/WP.24/2011/9. As the Working Party has not adopted specific rules of procedure, those of the Commission apply.
