GRRF agreed, at its seventy-eighth session, on amendments to UN Regulations No. 117, reintroducing provisions deleted in Amendment 2 to Revision 2. When preparing the corresponding WP.29 document, the secretariat also introduced two standard reference test tyre references, also deleted by Amendment 2 to Revision 2, and proposes to confirm this insertion.
