2. Identification of cargo flows on the Euro-Asian transport links

The Group of Experts may wish to consider a presentation by the "Scientific and Research Institute of Motor Transport" (NIIAT) from Moscow as the consultant for the drafting of the Euro-Asian Transport Links (EATL) Phase 3 report. The NIIAT will present the second draft of the Phase 3 report based on comments by the Group during the fourteenth session in October 2016. The Group of Experts may wish to review the presented draft and offer its opinion and guidance for the finalisation of the report.

The Group of Experts may also welcome presentations from representatives of main EATL stakeholders.

3. Facilitating of the coordination of integrated time schedules and tariffs on the Euro-Asian transport links

4. Identification of needs and requirements by producers, shippers, traders and freight forwarders in transport and trade on the Euro-Asian transport links routes

The Group of Experts may wish to recall that based on an adopted work plan (ECE/TRANS/WP.5/GE.2/2013/1) it shall identify transportation needs and requirements (including obstacles) which face producers, shippers, traders and freight forwarders along nine rail and road EATL corridors.

The Group of Experts will consider the presentations by producers, shippers, traders and freight forwarders who share their experiences, best practices, problems and proposals for solutions.

5. Information from participants on recent developments in transport infrastructure priority projects along the Euro-Asian transport links routes

The Group of Experts may wish to consider new information by Governments on this topic and provide guidance to the secretariat on possible actions.

6. Geographical Information Systems

The Group of Experts will continue to receive observations and guidance from the Governments and exchange views on the further development of the Geographical Information Systems (GIS), especially on the financing of this wing of the EATL project. A possible involvement of commercial enterprises in EATL GIS will also be considered.
