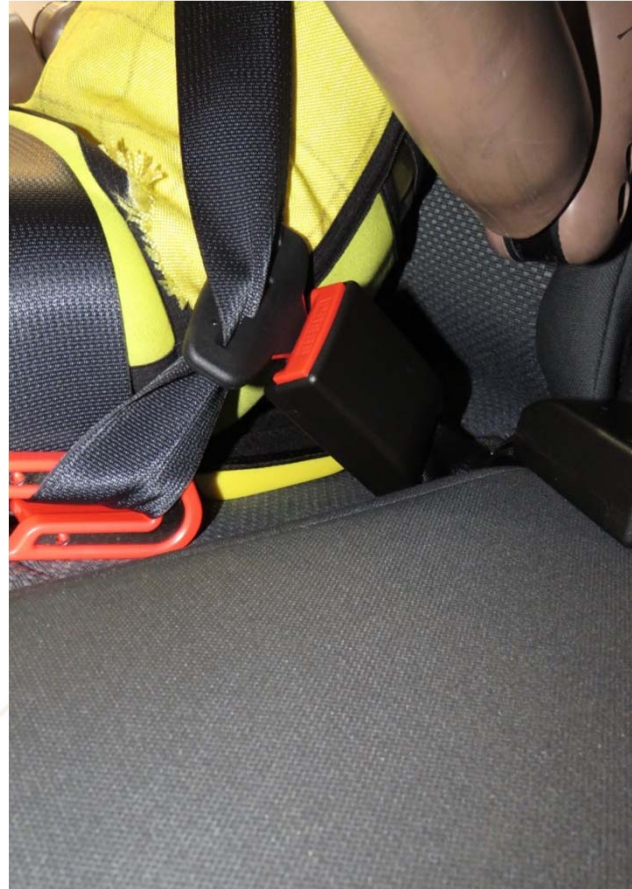

to effects such as narrow contact

Example of contoured seats that will influence installation of a child seat cushion, depending of its characteristics



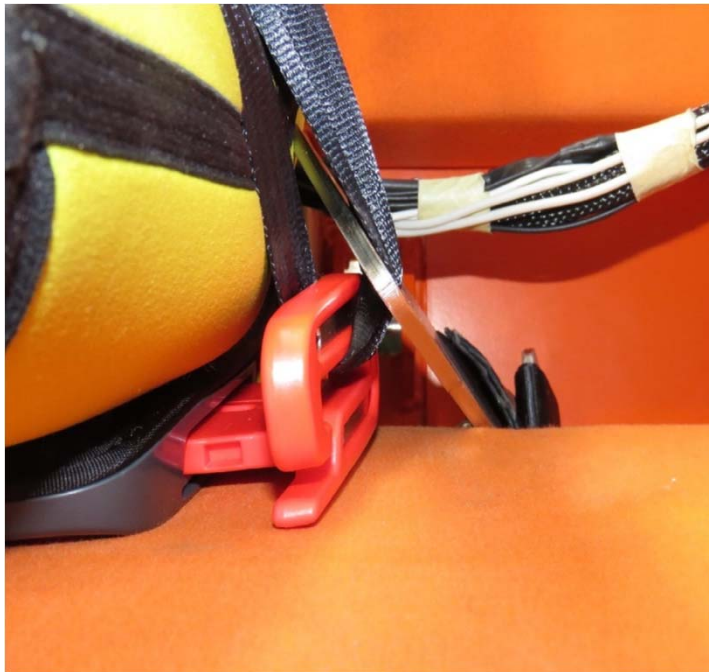
