Status update on the Global list informal working group

Introduction

1. The Sub-Committee has been studying the possibility of developing a global list of chemicals classified in accordance with the GHS since 2008. It has done considerable work in this regard, including a survey of international classification lists, developing a set of guiding principles, a pilot classification project, and a list comparison exercise.

2. The Global list informal working group last discussed the potential paths forward during a teleconference on 22 February 2018, but did not meet at the thirty-fifth or thirty-sixth session as the chair of the informal working group was not in attendance.

3. The Chair of the informal working group stepped down due to a new role and additional responsibilities, and the global list informal informal working group will now be co-chaired by the United States and Canada.
