

Covid-19 response Transport related matters

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Emergency measures - i

The Commission presented

- 16 March <u>Guidelines to Member States on health-related border management measures</u> to make sure that essential goods and services remain available.
- 17 March <u>Temporary Restriction on Non-Essential Travel to the EU</u> (EU Leaders agreed to temporary restriction of non-essential travel from third countries)
- 18 March Interpretative guidelines on EU passenger rights
- 23 March "Green lanes" initiative to ensure a continuous flow of goods across EU: Member States are requested to be open to all freight vehicles, whatever goods they are carrying.
- 26 March Guidance to ensure essential freight keeps moving by air.
- 17 April Joint European Roadmap towards lifting coronavirus containment measures
- 29 April Extension to the transposition period of the EU law on rail safety and interoperability



Emergency measures - ii

- 13 May Tourism and transport package, including
 - Communication towards a phased and coordinated approach for restoring freedom of movement and lifting internal border controls COVID-19
 - Guidelines on the progressive restoration of transport services and connectivity
 - Recommendation which aims to make travel vouchers an attractive alternative to cash reimbursement for consumers
- 25 May (Reg 2020/698) Extensions to the validity of certain certificates, licenses & authorisations; postponement of certain periodic checks & training
- 27 May Recovery Package proposal to kick-start the European economy following the Covid-19 crisis.
- <u>European Commission (DG MOVE) Portal 'EU transport measures as response to the Covid-19'</u> (https://ec.europa.eu/transport/coronavirus-response_en) set up in March 2020



Covid-19 responses Key Principles

- Ensure necessary safety conditions for transport (for both passengers and transport workers)
- Provisions should be transparent, proportionate, nondiscriminatory and coordinated.
- "Real-time" flow of data and information on traffic/mobility situation and safety conditions
- ➤ Lifting of restrictions & Recovery: **support businesses**, but at the same time **protecting passengers' rights**
- International coordination: necessary involvement of multilateral technical organisations (such as UNECE-ITC)
