GOAL



Significantly reduce the burden of road traffic accidents to people and economies around the world.

Building capacity of low- and middle-income countries to strengthen and sustain their national road safety systems to significantly improve road safety.

By 2020 halve the number of global deaths and injuries from road traffic accidents.



- Safe user Education for vulnerable road users Capacity development on child responsive urban planning and sustainable urban transport in Paraguay, the Philippines and South Africa

PROJECT PROPOSAL AND APPROVAL



- <u>Secretariat</u> organizes calls for project proposals
- Participating organizations coordinate and guide the design of project proposals, submit proposals and assist countries in the implementation
- <u>Secretariat</u> organizes evaluation of project proposals
- Steering Committee approves projects based on criteria and priorities set by Advisory Board for funding projects
