DRAFT SUPPLEMENT 2 TO REGULATION No. 39 (Speedometer equipment)

Note: The text reproduced below was adopted by the Administrative Committee (AC.1) of the amended 1958 Agreement at its fifth session, following the recommendation by the Working Party at its one-hundred-and-eleventh session. It is based on document TRANS/WP.29/R.769, not amended (TRANS/WP.29/534, paras. 57 and 119).

The distribution of documents of the Inland Transport Committee and its subsidiary bodies is limited. They are distributed only to governments, to specialized agencies and to governmental and non-governmental organizations which take part in the work of the Committee and of its subsidiary bodies, and should not be given to newspapers or periodicals.

Paragraph 5.1.1., amend to read:

"5.1.1. The graduations shall be of 1, 2, 5 or 10 km/h. The values of the speed shall be indicated on the dial as follows: when the highest value on the dial does not exceed 200 km/h, speed values shall be indicated at intervals not exceeding 20 km/h. When the maximum value on the dial exceeds 200 km/h, then the speed values shall be indicated at intervals not exceeding 30 km/h. The indicated speed value intervals need not be uniform."

Paragraph 5.1.2., amend to read:

"5.1.2. In the case of vehicles manufactured for sale in any country where imperial units are used, the speedometer shall also be marked in miles per hour (mph); the graduations shall be of 1, 2, 5 or 10 mph. The values of the speed shall be indicated on the dial at intervals not exceeding 20 mph and commencing at 10 or 20 mph. The indicated speed value intervals need not be uniform."
