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#### EXPLANATORY NOTES

The Intergovernmental Working Group to draw up a legally binding instrument on civil liability for transboundary damage caused by hazardous activities, within the scope of the UNECE Conventions on the Protection and Use of Transboundary Watercourses and International Lakes (Water Convention) and on the Transboundary Effects of Industrial Accidents (Industrial Accidents Convention) was established by the Parties to both Conventions at their joint special session at Geneva on 2-3 July 2001 (ECE/MP.WAT/7 - ECE/CP.TEIA/5). Its first meeting took place at Geneva on 21-23 November 2001 (MP.WAT/AC.3/2001/2 - CP.TEIA/AC.1/2001/2), its second meeting on 4-6 February 2002 (MP.WAT/AC.3/2002/3 - CP.TEIA/AC.1/2002/3), its third meeting on 6-8 May 2002 (MP.WAT/AC.3/2002/6 - CP.TEIA/AC.1/2002/6), its fourth meeting on 2-4 September 2002 (MP.WAT/AC.3/2002/11 - CP.TEIA/AC.1/2002/11), and its fifth meeting on 11-13 November 2003 (MP.WAT/AC.3/2002/14 - CP.TEIA/AC.1/2002/14).

Following the Rules of Procedure of the Economic Commission for Europe, the Working Group shall, at its first meeting of each year, elect its officers – a Chairperson and three Vice-Chairpersons. They shall be eligible for re-election.

# Item 5: Drawing up of a legally binding instrument on civil liability for transboundary damage caused by hazardous activities, within the scope of both Conventions

The Working Group will continue its work on a legally binding instrument on civil liability for transboundary damage caused by hazardous activities.

At its fifth meeting, the Working Group invited its rapporteur and the secretariat to prepare a revised version of a draft instrument (MP.WAT/AC.3/2003/2 - CP.TEIA/AC.1/2003/2) on the basis of the outcome of its fifth meeting.

The Working Group also requested the secretariat to prepare two working papers: one regarding the financial limits under article 8, and the other regarding the consequences that the inclusion of pipelines would have on annex I. Moreover, it invited delegations to submit working papers for consideration at the sixth meeting in addition to the working papers already submitted for the first, second, third, fourth and fifth meetings.

#### Item 6: Date and venue of future meeting(s) of the Intergovernmental Working Group

The Working Group is expected to set the indicative dates for its future meeting(s) and decide on its (their) venues. The secretariat has made preliminary arrangements for a meeting on 12-14 February 2003.

#### Item 7: Other business

At the time of writing, the secretariat had no points to propose under this agenda item.

#### Item 8: Closing of the meeting

The Chairperson will close the meeting.
