You're glumping the pond where the Humming-Fish hummed!


No more can they hum, for their gills are all gummed.

APPROACHES FOR ASSESSING BENEFITS

Environmental benefits

- Ecosystem approach toward assessing environmental health
- Coordinated efforts to cooperate over environmental data collection and publication

Social benefits

- In-depth case studies identifying the factors leading to political, environmental and social success
- Comparative case studies identifying common or uncommon characteristics in this case

Introduction History Benefits Lessons

LESSONS LEARNED

- Problem-solving approach is important Science advisory boards developed institutional legitimacy through solution-based assessment
- Public engagement is critical Public sentiment spurred realization of positive environmental and social outcomes
- Benefits are not always permanent
 One-time assessments of benefits do not guarantee sustainability
