




- Three new publications adopted
 - No one left behind: Good practices to ensure equitable access to water and sanitation in the pan-European region
 - Equitable access score-card: Supporting policy processes to achieve the human right to water and sanitation
 - Guide to Public Participation under the Protocol on Water and Health











- Programme of work 2014-2016 adopted, with priority areas
 - target setting, implementing measures and reporting
 - prevention and reduction of water-related diseases
 - small-scale water supply and sanitation



- safe & efficient management of water supply & sanitation systems
- support implementation at the national level
- equitable access to water and sanitation







Progress achieved

- Armenia, Georgia, Kazakhstan ... working towards accession
- Several countries have recently or nearly set targets
 - ... but many other Parties have failed in this obligation
- Outcomes of second reporting exercise demonstrated
 - Increased compliance with reporting guidelines & template
 - Improved overall quality of submitted reports
 - ... but still three countries failed to report





Compliance Committee

- New consultation process geared to help Parties implement their obligations under the Protocol, in particular
 - assist Parties in developing an accurate analysis of their situation (enabling them to set targets under the Protocol)
 - provide recommendations to Parties on how to improve situation
 - assist Parties in seeking support from donors, specialized agencies, ...
- Consultations do not have an inquisitive nature, initiated by a request from a Party
