# 1. Progress and achievements in this area of work in the triennium, esp. since 2014

- 26 Parties at present no accessions since the 3<sup>rd</sup> MOP
- Norway, Serbia, Slovakia set and communicated targets. Switzerland amentation of the Pro expected to communicate targets soon
- Armenia, Georgia, Kazakhstan working towards accession
- Capacity-building ongoing in support of accession and target setting
- Equitable access score-card: Moldova (ongoing), FYROM, Hungary
- Technical activities: prevention and reduction of water-related diseases small-scale water supplies and sanitation, safe and efficient management
- Consultation process under Compliance Committee Albania, Azerbaijan, Bosnia and Herzegovina – October 2015













### 2. Main results and lessons learned

#### Main results and success factors:

- \* Number of countries in process of/considering accession, in particular in the Caucasus and Central Asia
- \* Focus on supporting implementation through capacity building and development of guidance material
- \* Lead Parties and organizations play an active role in activities and promotion
- \* Partnerships with OHCHR. UNICEF, UNDP, OECD, EIB, EBRD, WHO Collaborative Centres and NGO networks (IWA, WECF)
- Growing recognition and increased visibility of the Protocol through intensive promotional work by the joint secretariat, Bureau and Protocol's focal points.

#### Lessons learned and challenges:

- Lack of financial resources (particularly staff costs, Compliance Committee)
- \* Changes in government structures interrupting accession procedures
- \* Number of Parties that have not yet fulfilled their obligation to set targets and target dates
- \* Further promotion is needed to raise awareness about the Protocol and its activities and tools
- NPDs have proved an extremely useful mechanism to support accession and target setting processes
- Synergies with the work under the Convention are important in light of the post-2015 development agenda, work in the area of water and climate change, etc.









# 3. Plans and priorities prior to the Meeting of the Parties to the Protocol in 2016

- \* 3<sup>rd</sup> reporting cycle starting in October 2015
- \* Revision of the reporting template and guidelines for the 4<sup>th</sup> reporting cycle
- \* Development of the 2017-2019 programme of work
- Preparations for the fourth session of the Meeting of the Parties
- \* Further capacity-building activities in support of accession and target setting processes
- \* Application of equitable access score-card in selected countries (Azerbaijan, Armenia, Belarus and Serbia)
