
Related articles of the Aarhus Convention

- Preamble, including para. 23 referring to the Espoo Convention
- Objectives (article 1)
- Definitions (Article 2)
- Access to information (article 4)
- Collection and dissemination of environmental information (article 5)
- Public participation in decisions on specific activities (article 6, including Annex I)

Joint responsibility of governments of Party of origin and affected Parties

If there is transboundary procedure public from affected Party (from areas likely to be affected) must have equivalent opportunities (Espoo Convention Art.2.6)







- Industry, including mining
- Transport
- Regional development
- Waste management
- Water management
- Telecommunications
- Tourism
- Town and country planning
- Land use

Protocol on Strategic Environmental Assessment

mainstreams environmental and health considerations into development planning and policymaking

Article 3 of the Protocol on SEA additionally provides a number of general rights to the public, similar to those of article 3 of the Aarhus Convention, including to:

- a. Relevant assistance and guidance from officials and authorities;
- b. Recognition of and support for relevant associations, organizations or groups (e.g., non-governmental organizations (NGOs));
- c. Exercise rights under the Protocol without being penalized, persecuted or harassed, and without discrimination as to citizenship, nationality or domicile.
