#### **Ministerial Conference for Spatial Planning**

- northern German federal states shall extend their regional development plans towards the territorial sea
- federal government shall develop a marine spatial planning strategy for the EEZ
  - ⇒ amendment of spatial planning law: extension to EEZ

#### Reasons for marine spatial planning




- More intense and diverse uses of oceans and coastal waters
- Merging of terrestrial and marine areas
- Conflicts of different users
- Germany: Different competences for the approval of activities in EEZ and territorial waters

#### **Information Base: CONTIS**



- Marine geo information system
- Possibility to map different types of uses approved and planned - as well as shipping routes and protected areas for nature conservation

#### **Planning Initiatives in Territorial Waters**



- Mecklenburg-Vorpommern: Regional Development Plan 2005, including territorial waters
  - "suitable areas" for offshore windenergy
  - "priority areas" for nature and landscape conservation as well as sand and gravel exploitation
  - "reserve areas" for tourism, nature and landscape conservation as well as sand and gravel exploitation
  - Shipping routes, SPA (EU Bird Directive) and FFH-Protected Areas are mapped for information only

### **Planning Initiatives in Territorial Waters**



Environmental Report (SEA-Directive)

• Schleswig-Holstein: at the moment no necessity is seen for a planning initiative



Setting up of "Goals and Principles for Spatial Planning regarding economic and scientific use as well as the security of navigation and the protection of the marine environment"

**Competence:** Federal Ministry of Transport, Building and Housing; preparatory steps to be carried out by Federal Maritime and Hydrographic Agency (BSH)

# Planning Initiative in the EEZ - Strategic Environmental Assessment



**Environmental Report -** Requirements of Attachment 1 of SEA-Directive have been incorporated into Spatial Planning Law

- actual state of environment and estimated development without realization
- actual threats to environment (esp. marine protected areas)
- estimated significant effects on the environment
- measures for prevention and/or minimization of environmental impacts
- intended monitoring measures

**2 Scoping-Hearings** (North Sea and Baltic Sea)

Discussion of necessary scope of environmental assessment with public authorities and organisations

Invitation of neighbouring states and opportunity to give comments

Poland was represented in the Hearing

Sweden: documents transmitted to several public authorities, BSH received comments





- 1) Status quo description of the environment
- 2) Status quo analysis of existing approved or priviliged uses in the North and Baltic Sea (i.e. windfarms, shipping routes)

#### - Further Steps



#### 3) Determination of

- Goals of Spatial Planning (legally binding)
- Principles of Spatial Planning (general statements)
- Priority Areas (no other use in this area)
- Reserve Areas (respective use has a special value)
- Suitable Areas (use may not be realized anywhere, but in this area)

for the different economic and scientific activities.

- contributes to the solution and avoidance of usage conflicts


### **Another Planning Instrument -**"Preferred Areas for Offshore Windenergy"



- Instrument introduced to Maritime Facilities Ordinance in 2002
- Aim: First step towards a better coordination of marine uses







# **Determination of "Preferred Areas" for Windenergy**



- Determination process is carried out by BSH and will be finished by the end of 2005
- Strategic Environmental Assessment
- "anticipated expert opinion", EIA is still mandatory
- Marine Spatial Plan: convertion into "priority areas"
