






Convention on the Protection and Use of Transboundary Watercourses and International Lakes (UNECE Water Convention, Helsinki, 1992) Transboundary waters means any surface waters or groundwaters, which mark, cross or are located on boundaries between two or more States



The Convention requires that additional specific measures are taken to prevent the pollution of groundwaters.





"Groundwater" means all water which is below the surface of the ground in the saturated zone and in direct contact with the ground or subsoil.

- Surface freshwater

- Waste water throughout the course of collection, transport, treatment and discharge or reuse.
