Romania has a long history and tradition in cooperating with its neighboring countries in the field of transboundary water resources, and is committed to a full and effective implementation of the Convention, that entering into in force in 1995, and approval the amendments of the art. 25 and 26 that show the open Convention, from 2006.

In this regards, bilateral Agreements are signed with neighboring countries on transboundary water cooperation: Ukraine (1997), Hungary (2003), Republic of Bulgaria (2004), and Republic of Moldova (2010) and is in process of negotiation of a new agreement with Republic of Serbia.

Under umbrella of the Convention, through of water diplomacy, in daily duty, remain the challenges of the harmonization technical regulations in specific issues (monitoring and assessments of waters, exchange of data information, floods protection) on round table, between EU and non-EU countries, taking into account that in Romania, Convention entering into in force in 1995, and the Ukraine acceded at the Convention in 1999.
