




- 1st Meeting of the core group of pilot projects and global network of basins working on adaptation to climate change, Geneva 20-21 February 2013



2. What are the main results and lessons learnt?

- Continued need for connecting to different water-related disciplines, like climate specialists and water managers
- Stakeholder involvement is prerequisite to reach solutions
- In disseminating information there is no one-size-fits-all solution
- Communication not only threats but also possible solutions
- Need for clear political commitment and will
- Extreme events need more attention
- Need for discussion what level of risk is acceptable
- Need for integrated approaches Nexus+
