
ENVSEC Priorities in South Caucasus

Highlights of the Project

Assessment of legal and institutional needs for ratification and implementation of the UNECE Water Convention

Analysis of costs associated with ratification and implementation of the UNECE Water Convection

Analysis of existing mechanisms of cooperation between Georgia and Azerbaijan



The Main Findings

Good legal basis for meeting requirements of the Convention

Discrepancies and gaps: prior licensing of wastewater discharges, application of BAT, water quality objectives and water monitoring

Costs will be incurred mostly by Business Sector (polluters)

State expenses: enforcement, monitoring, information exchange and early warning systems, conducting bilateral meetings, planning, etc.



Main Findings

Absence of institutional mechanism to support implementation of bilateral agreement on Cooperation in the Protection of the Environment (1997)
