Database of International Statistical Activities in the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe region

Note by the secretariat

Summary

The Database of International Statistical Activities incorporates the statistical work programmes of more than 30 international agencies conducting statistical work in the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe region. The Database of International Statistical Activities is organised according to a classification of statistical areas maintained by the Bureau of the Conference of European Statisticians. The present note provides the latest update of the status with the Database of International Statistical Activities and its classification.



I. Introduction

1. The Database of International Statistical Activities (DISA) is a compendium of statistical work carried out by international organizations in the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) region. The UNECE Statistical Division has been compiling the information at the request of the Conference since 1991. As of 2002, it is available on the web¹. It is updated annually to provide an overview of planned statistical work over the coming year.

2. The database was set up as a tool to help coordinate the international statistical work in UNECE region. It is used, for example, by the Conference of European Statisticians (CES) Bureau as a basis for the in-depth reviews of selected statistical areas. It provides an overview of the activities of different international organizations in specific areas which can help to identify duplication of work and gaps where new methodological work may be needed.

3. The information can be useful for the staff of national statistical offices, statisticians, researchers, students, etc. for finding out about the current statistical work of international organizations.

II. Classification of international statistical activities

4. The Database is structured according to the classification of statistical activities, the so-called DISA classification. The current version of the classification adopted in October 2009 is provided in Annex 1.

5. The Conference of European Statisticians, through its Bureau, is the owner of the classification, and is responsible for authorizing revisions as necessary. The UNECE secretariat, in collaboration with the Statistical Data and Metadata eXchange (SDMX) secretariat, is responsible for maintaining the explanatory notes to the classification, and any other material needed to aid interpretation and implementation².

6. The DISA classification has been adopted for various other purposes. For example, it is used for reporting on technical assistance activities by the Partnership in Statistics for Development in the 21st Century - PARIS 21 Consortium. The first three domains of this classification have been adopted as part of the SDMX standard. The classification is also being used for the Global Inventory of Statistical Standards currently developed under the auspices of the Coordinating Committee of Statistical Activities.

III. Current status

7. The 2012 issue of the Database is available online as of April 2012.

8. Over 30 international organizations (including city groups) were contacted to obtain contributions. The UNECE has received inputs from twenty-nine of them (status of 28 March 2012). The information received from the contributing organizations has been classified, checked for consistency and uploaded in DISA.
