Background

- UNCED to Rio +20: sustainable development to the green economy.
- Change in emphasis, not basics, but still controversial
- Problem of definition: « improving human well being and social equity, while significantly reducing environmental risks and ecological scarcities »
- Forest sector: sustainable forest management, ecosystem approach, certification, criteria and indicators, green economy
- Need to link forest sector to wider trends, find synthesis



Rovaniemi Action Plan for the Forest Sector in a Green Economy

- How the ECE region forest sector can lead the way to a green economy
- Vision, strategy and areas of activity
- Makes proposals, not binding
- · Comprehensive, detailed, action oriented



Five pillars of the Action Plan

- Sustainable consumption and production of forest products
- A low carbon forest sector
- Decent green jobs in the forest sector
- Long term provision of forest ecosystem services
- Policy development and monitoring of the forest sector in relation to a green economy

Monitoring and assessment in the Action Plan

- E.2.3 Develop the forest sector's contribution to broader green economy indicator sets
- E.5.1 Monitor green economy developments in the ECE region forest sector and ensure that organisations active on global green economy issues, such as UNEP, are aware of them
