#### Socio-Economic Impact Assessment at a Glance




- Nationwide socio-economic impact assessment of the COVID-19 crisis, covering 125 communities and settlements across all 10 Marzes and Yerevan
- Builds primarily on data collected in May and June 2020 from 3,000 households,
   2,100 local businesses/farmers as well as over 600 representatives of Mazpetarans, local self-governance bodies and service structures
- Presents 37 evidence-based recommendations for more targeted and risk-informed response and recovery in Armenia



#### System Map of the Socio-Economic Impact Assessment








# IMMEDIATE ECONOMIC IMPACT OF COVID-19

#### Strong immediate negative impact on business continuity



**Key Finding:** The impact on a SME's business continuity correlates with their essential characteristics and field of business. The most negatively impacted SMEs operate in tourism, food service, transport and beauty services. Agriculture has been relatively less affected.

#### The magnitude of COVID-19's impact on SMEs by activity field, % in sectoral total




#### Strong immediate negative impact on SMEs, particularly in urban areas



**Key Finding:** Great differences in impact on SMEs across community types are noted. Urban areas, and particularly Yerevan, are the hardest hit.


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#### Strong immediate impact on employment in Armenia




**Key Finding:** During the lockdown, most SMEs temporary ceased their operations. Job reductions in SMEs have impacted women more than men.


#### Escalating levels of poverty and vulnerabilities


#### Difficulties if the pandemic will continue


