



Technical considerations for the dashboard

- UNECE EXCOM requested that the dashboard should be:
 - based on existing data sets and statistics
 - produced by existing UNECE resources
 - include a general overview of all 17 goals
- Currently the dashboard and database:
 - include data available in the global SDG database maintained by UNSD
 - present a selection of indicators relevant to the region where data are available (about 80 indicators)

Technical considerations – cont.

- Dashboard planned to be developed in stages:
 - 1st stage based on global SDG database data
 - 2nd stage add national official values from NRPs or websites
- Necessary for retrieving national data for a regional database:
 - Automatic transfer/harvesting of data from NRPs or websites (using SDMX, API, etc.)
 - Data according to the global SDG indicators (no proxies or national indicators)
- Situation in end of 2019
 - 35 (out of 56) UNECE countries had (some) SDG data on the web
 - automatic download possible for 3-4 countries (with customisation needed)
- Situation in March 2021
 - 42 UNECE countries have an NRP (or a similar platform)
 - Possible to download all data with 1 click from about 11 countries (Excel table)
 - Limited number of countries piloting SDMX and SDG Data Lab



Conclusions

- There is (slow) progress
- Standardised/harmonised solutions needed (SDMX, API, etc.)
- To include national data for global SDG indicators in a regional database – not yet feasible
- Many NRPs have the same structure makes finding data much easier
