- Gender Gaps persist in many sectors at all levels of decision making in MS
- Gender Parity is still a goal for staff in various categories in the UN, panels, task forces and meeting participants
- Gender Equality as part of the 2030 Agenda (SDG 5 and is mainstreamed in rest SDGs)



### Situation in ECE region: Inequalities across the region persist





Women are less likely to participate in the labour market.



Gender segregation in the labour market remains prevalent.



The gender pay gap persists.



Boardrooms continue to be male dominated.



Women remain underrepresentative in parliaments.



Physical and sexual violence against women perseveres.

- To advance equal participation in decision-making in ECE and in all areas of work
- To mainstream a gender perspective in the substantive work of the Sectoral Committees
- To contribute to reducing gender inequalities in its MS, including in access to and control of resources and benefits of development in the pertinent areas of ECE

#### **Priority areas:**

- Gender mainstreaming as a key strategy at cross-sectoral and divisional level
- Gender and Economy
- Organizational culture and gender parity
- Accountability
- Building Capacity
- Working in partnership

# Example: GM in International Policy Dialogue





- Include women in panels (IGC initiative)
- Incorporating gender perspective in agenda and interventions
- Foster a policy dialogue applying a gender lens
- Organize meetings/projects to focus on topics related to gender, i.e. a policy seminar on promoting women in innovation for sustainabe development to bring specific research and empirical evidence
- Monitor and report
