Development of global SDG indicators



- UN General Assembly adopted the **17 goals 169 and targets** in September 2015
- United Nations Statistical Commission (UNSC) established **Interagency and Expert Group on SDG Indicators (IAEG-SDG)** in March 2015
<https://unstats.un.org/sdgs/iaeg-sdgs/>
 - **Country led process**, 28 countries are members (represented by national statistical offices), all other countries and international organizations are observers
 - **Develop a list of indicators for SDG monitoring at the global level**
 - Provide support for the implementation of the indicator framework until 2030, review capacity building, report on progress towards SDGs
 - **2020 and 2025 comprehensive reviews. Reviews approved by the UN Statistical Commission**
- 11 meetings of IAEG-SDGs held, 10 virtual, next open virtual meeting [23 June 2021](#)

Global SDG indicators



- **Global list of 231 unique indicators (+ 12 repeated in different targets) - for global review and follow-up**
- Developed and maintained by IAEG-SDGs (28 countries)
- UN General Assembly approved on 6 July 2017


Tier system to assess availability of the indicators (2021 update)

- **Tier 1** – internationally agreed methods and data widely available **130**
 - **Tier 2** – agreed methods exist but data are not widely available **97**
 - **Multiple Tiers** – different components of the indicator are classified into different tiers **4**

Global SDG indicators



- United Nations Statistical Commission – highest body of global statistical system – annual meetings
- IAEG-SDGs – report and refinement proposals
- 2021 report on COVID-19 and the global SDG indicators - 74 unique indicators (of the 231 in the Global Framework) that are likely to reflect the Goals highly impacted by the global pandemic
- 9.1.2 Passenger and freight volumes, by mode of transport



UNECE work in statistics



■ Conference of European Statisticians (CES), since 1952

- **members: Heads of statistical offices**
- **About 70 countries: UNECE + all OECD + countries from outside the region** participate in the work
Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Mexico, Australia, New Zealand, Korea, Japan, China, Mongolia, South Africa, etc.
- major **international organisations** participate to ensure coordination and avoid duplication (EU, OECD, IMF, WB, UNSD, CIS-STAT, ILO, WHO, UN Environment, FAO, EEA, UNFCCC, etc.)
- UNECE works with **experts from countries and international organizations** through steering groups, task forces and task teams
 - Statistical Division coordinates, facilitates, makes things happen
 - demand driven, at the request of countries
