- Members: Slovenia (chair), Germay, Latvia, Russian Federation, IRU, EU Commission, Turkey (TOBB)
- ► Goal: a paper on the operationalization of e-CMR till SC.1 116 session
- Action plan: 26.5.2020 (Kick-off meeting) in period to July 2021 (a few meetings), July - October (finalization)
- On a voluntary basis

Background and introduction

- ► Inland Transport Committee (ITC) encouraged the Working Party for Road Transport (SC.1) to increase its efforts to advocate and raise awareness of the e-CMR benefits
- ► ITC expressed support for SC.1 being the main platform for multilateral dialogue and the exchange of practices by e-CMR implementing contracting parties
- Rapid changes in the world through technology advances
- Digitalization boosted by Covid 19 pandemic
- Anticipation that the demand for replacing paper-based consignment notes with electronic ones will increase substantially (especially among EU members)

Benefits of implementing e-CMR

- Time savings and reductions in administrative costs
- Facilitation of transport processes
- Access to information in real time
- Enhanced health and safety
- Reduction in paper consumption
- ► Trade and innovation spillovers

Costs of implementing e-CMR

 Design, implementation, and maintenance costs for businesses/industry

Possibly: Design, implementation, and maintenance costs for authorities

e-CMR pilot projects

- Multinational projects
 - ► DIGINNO-Proto Projects (Baltic countries + Poland)
 - ► AEOLIX Living Lab 12 project Czech Republic, Germany, Greece, Romania, and Serbia
 - Benelux e-CMR project
- National and binational projects
 - France and Spain
 - France, the Netherlands, and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland
 - Slovenia
 - Slovenia and Turkey

Lessons learned

- Changing from paper-based to electronic consignment notes reduces administrative costs, saves time and gives rise to business efficiencies, among other benefits
- Pilot projects have been performed towards the operationalization of e-CMR
- E-CMR has the scope to be part of a multimodal electronic transport document in the ultimate future

Conclusions

- ► A paper by the informal group of experts on the operationalization of e-CMR:
 - ► CMR contracting states encouraged to accede to e-CMR
 - ► SC.1 to be used as the platform for exchange of info and best practices on e-CMR implementation
 - ▶ Pilot projects are very useful for exploring/refining possibilities of e-CMR implementation
 - ► SC.1 secretariat may wish to consider appropriate future actions based on this paper
