

Some Key figures

Vehicle fleet: 450 million

Cross border accidents 455.000

Cash flow turn – rough estimate 1,5 billion EUR



Financial stability

- Financial Guarantees (transitional members and monitored members)
- Bank Guarantee + reinsurance contract
- Causes: lack of discipline and/or failure to perform the financial obligations individual insurers
- Impact: handling Bureaux are not reimbursed in time liquidity issues
- Limited instruments are at the disposal of the National Guaranteeing Bureau and even less to the CoB (failures of the controlling authorities)
- Draw down on the Bank Guarantee of the BG Bureau
- International sanctions (IR and BY)



Membership issues

- Armenia negotiations are on going (challenged by the difficulties resulting from Nagorno Karabakh region)
- Israel is leaving the GC system (low number of Green Card issued // particularities in the IL legal system – no fault system – limited reimbursement)
- Challenged by new applications for membership (outside the scope of the Green card system)

Geographical scope

CoB-Membership is limited to:

Countries lying to the West of the Ural Mountains and the Caspian Sea

and

to the countries bordering the Mediterranean Sea.

==> future Membership possible for:

- Armenia, Georgia and Kazakhstan
- Algeria, Egypt, Lebanon, Libya and Syria

Geographical scope



Solution(s) ???

To be discussed with UNECE

 Umbrella organisation for the different card systems – in the beginning documented / steered by CoB

 With ... possibility to sign bilateral agreements between members of different card systems



Harmonisation Process

- Guarantee Funds, Compensation Bodies and Information centres of EEA = new members of the CoB (since September GA 2020)
- Improvement of the protection and rights of victims of a cross border traffic accident = mirror effect of GC system (basis EU directive – limited to EEA)
- Complexity increased of cross border traffic accident – CoB website: competent body search engine

Victims Charter

- Charter of Road Traffic Victims Rights
- Common initiative of UNECE, IETL and CoB
- Promotion of the charter to contribute to the reinforcement of victims' rights following the occurrence of a road traffic accident



Collaboration platform

- For all CoB member (including the new members)
- Consolidated knowledge base
- Full process of the organisation of Committees and Working Groups (with also the possibility to cocreate documents on the platform)
- To exchange and collaborate in their day-to-day business (with full respect of DP(GDPR) rules / uniformisation in exchange/ respect of deadlines / follow up on their performance)



Green Card: from paper to digital

Dedicated WG on e-IMIC created in 2018

Final goal of the WG

Find a solution to check the validity of the insurance cover without any paper document but via electronic means

- Accessing secure information in real time benefit to all parties involved
- CoB Members (immediate result on insurance inquiry)
- Victims (> faster compensation)
- Policy holders (quicker and more reliable service from insurers)
- Insurers (reduced costs for the insurance market)
- National Police and/or border control (real time info on insurance situation)

Green Card: from paper to digital

- Interim steps :
- > From black on Green to black on White
- Since 01/07/2020 possibility to issue Black on White
- 28 member countries are currently issuing black on white IMICs
- 10 out of these 28 are issuing solely black on white IMICs and no longer black on green IMICs

Green Card: from paper to digital

- Next step (to be decided on by the SC.1 during the 116th Session):
- The possibility to present IMICs in PDF on electronic devices (e.g. smartphone, laptop, tablet)
- Future:
- Paperless international proof of valid MTPL
 insurance for the country visited data base

- Shifting from Annex no.1 to RE.4 to a self-contained Consolidated Resolution;
- Main advantages: Ease of reference and readability

Requested changes / clarifications in the text:

- Change of the title -> "Consolidated Resolution on the International Motor Insurance System – known as the "Green Card System")";
- Preamble: to set the context of the Consolidated Resolution
- Card -> Certificate (more in line with the electronic form);
- Green Card replaced in the text with International Motor Insurance Certificate, e.g. International Motor Insurance Certificate -> also known as the Green Card (reference to the Green Card is still kept)
- Possibility to present IMICs in PDF in an electronic form (para.4)

COUNCIL OF BUREAUX

Requested changes / clarifications in the text:

- Print the IMIC -> provide the IMIC (para. 4);
- [...] on behalf of the Bureau which either provided the IMIC or authorised its member insurer to do so (para. 7);
- French version of the IMIC is no longer mandatory > deleted. Two appendices left.
- Back of the IMIC is voluntary.
- Reference to the website of the CoB added for further information, if needed.

COUNCIL OF BUREAUX

Cosmetic changes in the text:

- Renumbering of the text due to the Preamble -> e.g. Chapter II (i.e. Recommendations) starts with paragraph 2;
- Article switched to paragraph (para. 2);
- <u>-</u>bureau -> Bureau;
- [...] the Council of Bureaux (para. 3).
