At its informal session of 9 May 2022, the Group completed its discussion on the subjects of "cycling streets" signs and on the possibility of introducing a "non-compulsory cycle track" sign. As decided at that session, the Chair has subsequently revised Informal document No. 1 (9 May 2022) and is tabling it for final comments and a possible adoption by the Group of Experts.
