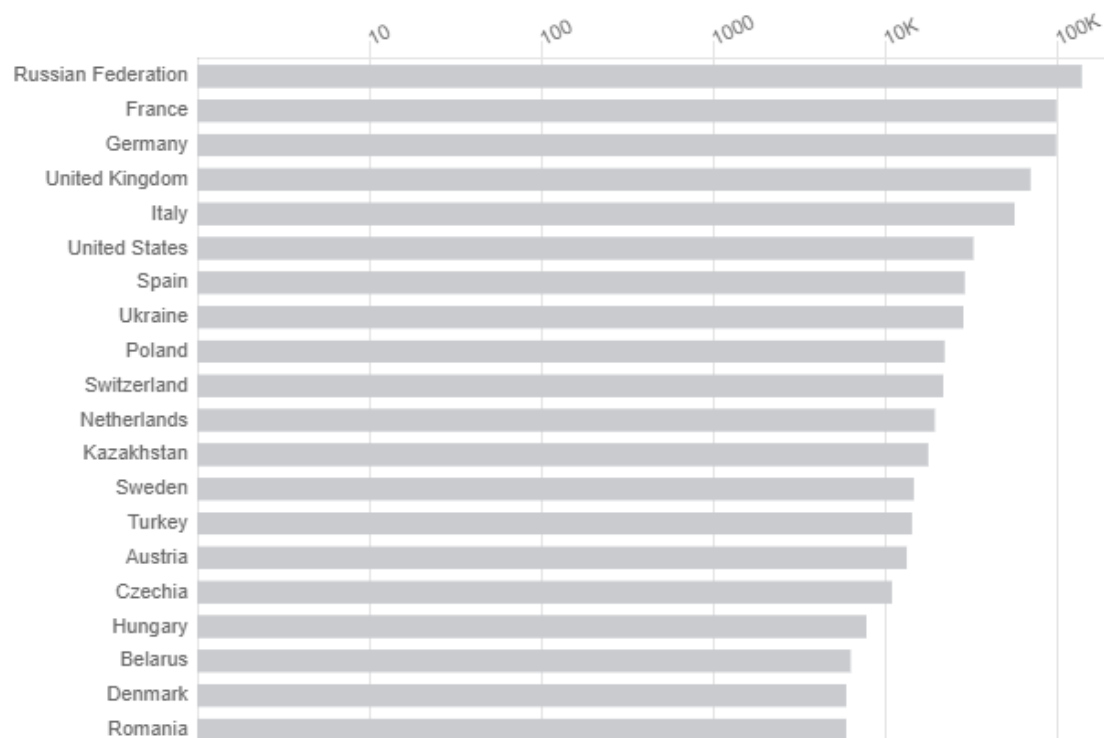

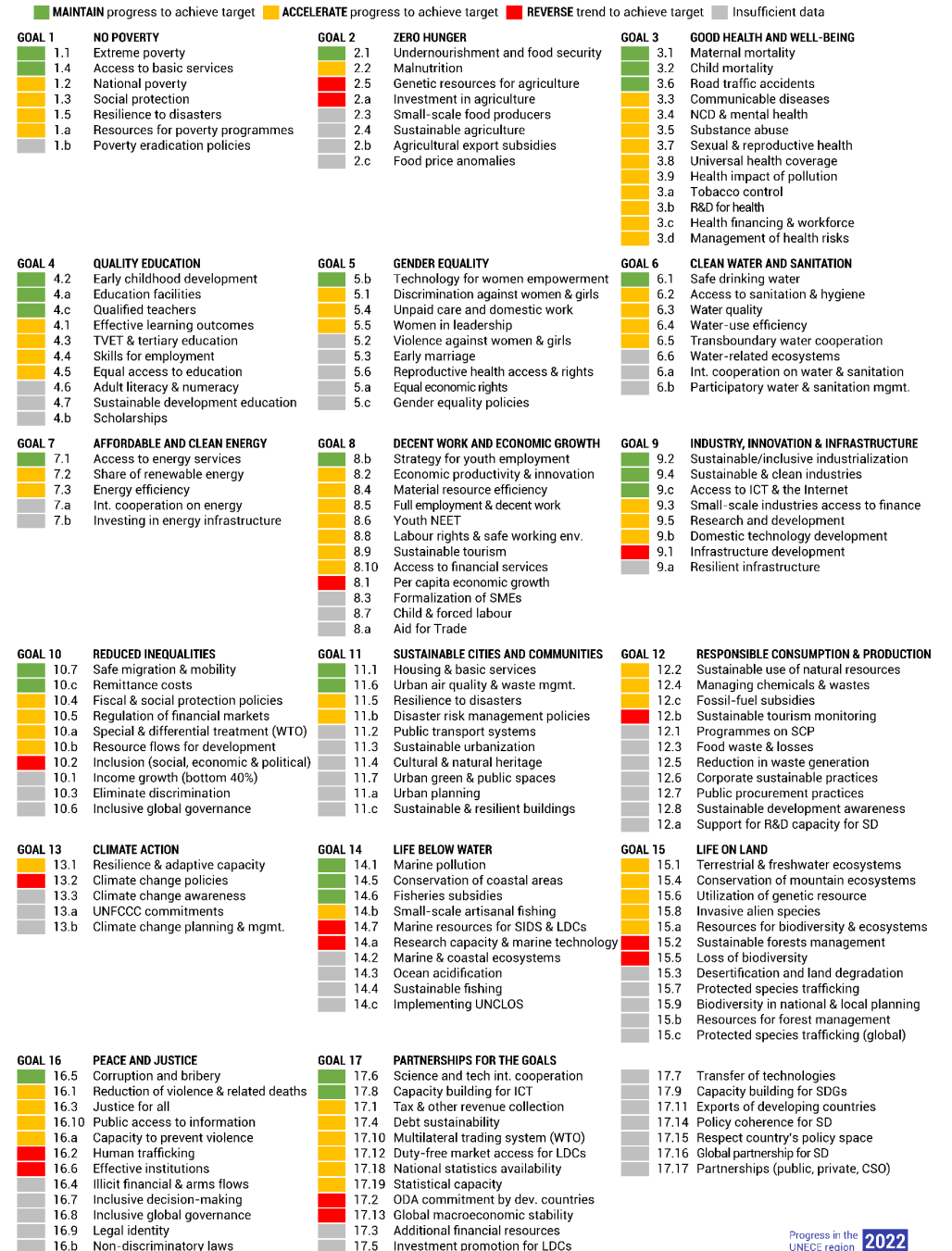

## Anticipated Progress Index

- Indicator values for 2030 estimated based on rate of change between 2000 and 2021
- Anticipated gap between target value and estimated value for 2030
- Median indicator values for region
- Target values: explicitly defined (30%) or set according to top performers in region

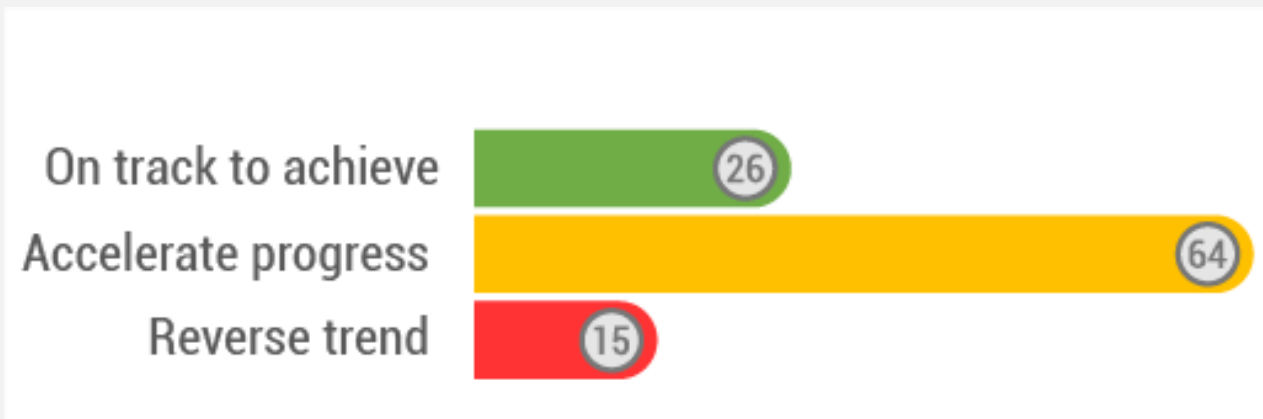
## Indicator inclusion criteria

- 2+ data points available for 15+ countries
- Ability to set transparent target value

# Progress Assessment



- **More data are available**
  - 105 targets can be measured in 2022 compared to 89 in 2021
  - 40% of targets cannot be measured

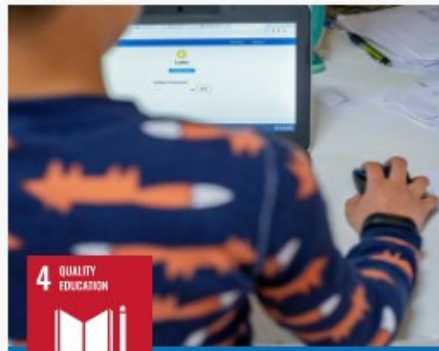
