

NOK 640 billion Central government administration spending:


**54 %** Buildings, infrastructure and property



## Why innovative public procurement?



- Potential to get more out of the 640 billion spent on acquisitions
  - Better demand coverage
  - Growth and development in the private sector
- What is innovative procurement all about?

#### **Procurement practises**



- Too few public sector bodies try out innovative acquisitions
- Focus on the solution, not the need
- Limited capacity and competence
- The competitive potential is not taken out
- The market and suppliers are not used strategically



# **Barriers**

- Strategic leadership anchoring
- Lack of interdisciplinary collaboration
- Risk aversion zero error culture
- Better competence in the entire process
  - How to identify needs
  - How to work with market dialogue
  - How to formulate functional requirements
  - How to evaluate functional requirements
  - Contract and contract follow-up




