Background

In the follow up to the <u>Innovation for Sustainable Development Review of Georgia</u>, 2021, UNECE is supporting the Government of Georgia in the implementation of the I4SDR recommendations under the dedicated capacity-building programme. The programme is aimed at building the capacities of the Georgia's Innovation and Technology Agency (GITA) and the State Procurement Agency of Georgia (SPA) to promote and implement the concept of innovation-enhancing public procurement (IEP), drawing on the recommendations of Chapter 5 of the I4SDR as well as the national reform priorities of the Republic of Georgia. The activities under this programme will also be used to inform the chapter on IEP within the forthcoming Interim Sub-regional Innovation Policy Outlook being prepared by UNECE



In the context of its Association Agreement with the European Union, the Government of Georgia is making significant efforts in aligning its legislation with EU acquis. A recent example is the amendment to the Georgian legislation on public procurement. The legislation describes and introduces for the first time one of the public procurement procedures for innovation partnerships. This important positive reform outcome requires developing and amending the regulatory framework, including the so-called "soft law" (manuals and guidelines) on innovation partnerships, and building the capacities of the SPA and GITA to implement the new mechanism.

To this end, the UNECE developed a handbook on international best practices on IEP of goods with a focus on green and energy-efficient procurement. As a follow-up, this study visit will bring Georgian officials from SPA and GITA to Norway, a UNECE member State with a proven track

record and good practices in IEP, for exchange of experience and peer learning.

Objectives

This study visit will present the experience of IEP implementation in Norway to help guide reform efforts in this area in Georgia. Exchange of experience and the sharing of practical IEP cases and approaches to procurement in Norway and Georgia will be at the center of the programme. Also included will be an exchange with representatives of the Science Park in Oslo which hosts innovative start-ups taking part in IEP to incorporate private sector views on opportunities and challenges of the IEP.

Participation

This study visit brings together four representatives of the Georgian State Procurement Agency and two representatives of Georgia's Innovation and Technology Agency, the expert who led the development of the handbook on IEP good practices for Georgia, representatives of relevant Norwegian institutions involved in IEP, and the UNECE secretariat. The lead expert will also use the visit to gather information relevant to his assignment of drafting the sub-regional chapter on IEP of the UNECE Interim Sub-regional Innovation Policy Outlook. The study trip, its discussions and the information collected will in general will be leveraged for this upcoming publication.
