



#### **Travel restrictions introduced in March 2020**




# Aim of this presentation

  - persons born outside the EU/Nordics




# **Immigration of persons born in the EU27 and Nordic countries**






#### **Clear differences by country of birth**






# Largest decline in asylum migration

Immigration of persons born outside the EU/Nordic countries by type of residence permit




#### **Decline in asylum migration by country of birth**

These seven countries accounted for 59% of the immigration of persons born outside the EU/Nordics due to asylum in 2021




### Large labour migration of persons born in India

These seven countries accounted for 50% of the immigration of persons born outside the EU/Nordics due to work in 2021




## **Slightly higher percentage of men**

Labour migration by sex, 2021




Country of birth

## **Summary**

- Which groups contributed the most to the decline in immigration in 2020?
  - Especially persons born outside the EU/Nordics
  - All types of residence permit, but mostly asylum migration
- Which groups contributed the most to the relative increase in 2021?
  - Labour migration outside the EU/Nordics, especially of persons born in India
  - Men and women on their 30s and 20s, often highly educated
  - But also from the EU/Nordics, especially of persons born in Germany, Poland and Romania
