

Introduction


- Luxembourg situated in the heart of the EU-27
- 645 397 inhabitants on the 1st January 2022
- Many European institutions
- 205 000 cross-border commuters (2020)





Population growth since 1960

- +103% for Luxembourg
- +27% for EU-27
- +48% in France / + 27% in Belgium / +15% in Germany



Evolution of the population by nationality since 1871




Evolution since 2001:

Data source

- Migration statistics based on Population Register (RNPP)
- **Population Register:** 102 registers at municipality level 1 at national level **RNPP** Interconnected **Municipality 2** Municipality 3 **Municipality 4 Municipality 1 STATEC** 10

Data source: declaration of residence

- By law, any person, regardless of nationality, who **establishes residence in a municipality of Luxembourg** must, upon their arrival, declare their presence to the census office (Bureau de la population) of the municipal administration of the new place of residence.
- **EU nationals or nationals of a country treated as such**, as well as the members of their family (regardless of their nationality), must declare their arrival to the municipality of residence if they plan to **stay longer than 3 months** in Luxembourg. The declaration of arrival must be filed **within 8 days** of occupying the new residence.
- Third-country nationals who are not family members of an EU national (or a national of a country treated as such) must declare their arrival to the municipality of the new place of residence within 3 days of occupying the new residence, regardless of how long they plan to stay in the country.


Data source: moving abroad

- In the case of a **departure from Luxembourg in order to settle down in another country**, a **declaration of departure** must be filled in the current municipality of residence before the departure.
- The declaration of departure must be filled **no later than on the day before the departure**.
- But, the reality is different. Emigration is not always declared.
- For any person who establishes his habitual residence abroad, the deletion from the municipal register takes place on the basis of the declaration of departure and on the date thereof. In the absence of a declaration of departure, the deletion takes place on the basis of information from the municipality as part of its mission to manage the population register.
- Deletion after emigration → Statistical adjustments



Net migration by citizenship since 1960




- First **IT** in the industrial era, decline from the 1960s, recovery since the 2000s
- Then **PT** since 1967
- Negative balances of **PT** during economic crises (75, 85, etc.), but recovery of these migrations with economic recovery
- Border countries less affected by economic crises
- FR have exceeded PT since 2014





- Luxembourg borders remained open

- Then, increase, level similar to the pre-covid period

Migration during the COVID-19: immigration
















- EUROSTAT: less optimistic view

Conclusions



Conclusions

- Decline in immigration in 2020: -11% compared to the 2017/2019 period
- Increase in emigration in 2020: +3% compared to the 2017/2019 period
- Immigration: decline over only few months
- Thereafter, return to pre-COVID levels
- No major changes in the demographic characteristics of migrants
- Luxembourgers are emigrating more and more
- Migration in the following years: assumptions of migration to pre-COVID levels
