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European Agreement on Important International Combined Transport Lines and Related Installations: Amendment proposals

Proposal for amending the annexes I and II of the European Agreement on Important International Combined Transport Lines and Related Installations

Transmitted by the Government of Denmark

I. Background/explanation

Denmark believes that the Danish routes and installations with importance for international combined transport as identified in the annexes of the Agreement on Important International Combined Transport Lines and Related Installations (AGTC) should be updated.

The reason behind this is that several Danish routes and installations identified in the current version of the AGTC agreement are no longer in use for combined transport or transport of goods by rail. One of the main reasons for this being the adoption of the EU's regulation on Union guidelines for the development of the trans-European transport network. Also known as the TEN-T regulation.

II. Proposed amendment

A. Annex I, Railway lines of importance for international combined transport, (14) Denmark


Modify the existing line C 45/1 as follows

C 45/1 (Malmø)-København-Fredericia-Padborg (-Flensburg)

Contracting parties concerned: Sweden, Germany and Denmark

Delete the following line

C-E 451 Nykøbing-Gedser (-Rostock) Contracting parties concerned: Germany and Denmark



B. Annex II, Installations important for international combined transport

1. A. Terminals of importance for international combined transport

Modify the list of terminals as follows

2. B. Border crossing points of importance for international combined transport

Exclude the following border crossing point(s)
