- Exchange of experience and best practices, and promotion of cooperation and knowledge-sharing
- Capacity-building at international, national and local levels
- Research on topics which will contribute to the better implementation of the Charter
- Collection and exchange of information on best practice on Charter implementation





Tirana, Albania


Assessment

- 2015: Albania has 286 informal settlements
- Tirana's population has quadrupled in 20 years, from around 200,000 in 1992 to 800,000 today
- Such severe urbanization resulted in serious problems such as shortages in infrastructure, particularly housing. This period was accompanied by high residential development.
- 2012: informal areas in the urban area of Tirana comprised approximately 900 ha and a population of 75,000 inhabitants

Response

 The most significant intervention from the Municipality of Tirana is the adoption of a supportive fiscal package from March until August 2020




