




## Preparation of the 2023-2025 Programme of work

#### OBJECTIVE

The objective of this Protocol is to promote at all appropriate levels, nationally as well as in transboundary and international contexts, the protection of human health and well-being, both individual and collective, within a framework of sustainable development, through improving water management, including the protection of water ecosystems, and through preventing, controlling and reducing water-related disease. (Article 1)



# Programme Area 7: Increasing resilience to climate change

- Events at the regional and subregional levels on strengthening the climate resilience of the water and sanitation sectors: One workshop organized together wit the Water Convention;
- Events exploring interlinkages with other sectors;
- Develop guidance/collection of good practices on strengthening the climate resilience of water and sanitation sectors and services, across other relevant actors;
- Building capacity to promote the adoption of good practices in strengthening the climate resilience of the water and sanitation sectors;
- Analysis of the relation between NDCs, NAPs and targets set under the Protocol and the development of recommendations on how to increase those linkages;
- Develop a document or tool on financing climate-resilient drinking water and sanitation services, including in relation to investment planning.



# Programme Area 8: Raising awareness on the Protocol and facilitating accession

- Foster communication and promotion of the Protocol through different activities, including website update, networking on social media, participation in major international events and production of promotional materials;
- Organize upon demand national and/or subregional workshops to promote accession;
- Provide technical and legal advice related to accession to the Protocol, upon demand, including through the development of a targeted publication, if needed.

Resource Requirements: 113,100 USD



## **Programme Area 9: Compliance procedure**

### **Activities**:

- a) Compliance Committee meetings
- b) Consultation process upon request
- c) Awareness-raising on compliance procedure and the legal dimension of the Protocol

Resource Requirements: 349,200 USD
